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Introduction

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The Office of Institutional Research (IR) administers an ongoing survey to graduates of OCC ten months following their graduation date. The objective of the survey is to measure student satisfaction with various aspects of students' experiences at OCC, as well as to answer questions concerning subsequent employment status and continued education.

Methodology

Both surveys are comprised of multiple choice and open-ended questions. The survey responses were gathered on graduates via mailed surveys and telephone surveys. This report is based on responses from OCC Dental Hygiene graduates from August 2003 through June 2004. There were 27 Dental Hygiene graduates during the 2003-04 academic year. This analysis is comprised of responses from 12 of these graduates.

Findings from the Graduate Follow-up Survey (GFS)

General

- A total of 27 Dental Hygiene students graduated during the 2003-04 academic year,
 - > 12 of the Dental Hygiene graduates responded to the Graduate Follow-up Survey.
- The average age of Dental Hygiene graduates for this study was 29 years of age.
- The race/ethnicity breakdown for respondents included 11 Caucasian students and 1 Hispanic student.

Employment

- Ten of the respondents stated that they were employed part-time as a Dental Hygienist.
- Respondents indicated that they work an average of 27.6 hours per week.
- The mean salary reported was \$34,000 per year (N=7). Salary ranged from a low of \$25,000 to a high of \$50,000.

Overall Satisfaction

- Eleven of the respondents said that they definitely would still choose the OCC Dental Hygiene Program and 1 respondent said they probably would still choose the OCC Dental Hygiene Program if given the chance to start over again.
- All of the respondents were at least somewhat satisfied with the overall quality of teaching. Ten of the twelve respondents said that they were very satisfied and 2 said they were somewhat satisfied with the overall quality of teaching at OCC.
- All of the respondents were very satisfied with the overall quality of their education.
- Ten respondents were very satisfied and 2 respondents were somewhat satisfied with the overall quality of teaching.

Oakland Community College Dental Hygiene Report – GFS December 2005

Preparedness¹

- Eleven of the respondents strongly agreed that they frequently use the knowledge gained from their Dental Hygiene education in their current jobs.
- Further, all of the respondents somewhat agreed (n = 1) or strongly agreed (n = 11) that their OCC degree helped to better prepare them for their current positions.
- Eight respondents strongly agreed and 1 respondent somewhat agreed that their OCC degree/certificate helped them to advance in their current place of employment. Only 1 respondent felt that their OCC degree/certificate did not help them to advance in their current place of employment.

Importance and Satisfaction Ratings of Specific Elements of the OCC Experience for 2003-04 (continued)

- Students rated the 'Overall Quality of Education' (3.75), 'Overall Level of Intellectual' Growth' (3.75), and 'Overall Quality of Teaching' (3.75) as the most important aspects of their educational experience. Students rated 'Career Planning Services' (3.29), General Education/Support Courses' (3.33) and 'Academic Advising by Counselors' (3.33) as the least important aspects of their educational experience.
- Students were most satisfied with the following aspects of their educational experience at OCC: 'Overall Quality of Education' (4.00) and 'Overall Experience as an OCC Student' (4.00), and 'Out of Class Access to Faculty' (4.00). Students were least satisfied with 'Academic Advising by Counselors' (3.08), 'Career Planning Services' (3.33), and 'Quality of Classroom Facilities' (3.50),
