2. CHANCELLOR'S REPORT

2.1 Chancellor's Comments

Interim Chancellor Brantley made the following comments:

- The College community is saddened by the death of Thomas Kress, Counselor at the Royal Oak/Southfield Campus.
- The STEPS (Science Technology Engineering Preview) Program at the Auburn Hills Campus had 23 participants from 16 different high schools. Participants were introduced to non-traditional careers for women and had the opportunity to discuss careers with engineers, executives and business owners.
- Two new student orientation sessions at the Auburn Hills Campus drew 157 parents and 256 students.
- Auburn Hills Campus President Dolly was nominated to serve on the AACC Commission on Research, Technology and Emerging Trends for a three-year term.
- Two hundred twenty-seven students will begin the nursing program this fall. An additional 40 are enrolled in the transitional practical nursing program.
- The Levinson Hall Health Wing, located at the Highland Lakes Campus, received an honorable mention at the Education Designers' Showcase.
- The Culinary Studies Institute at the Orchard Ridge Campus hosted the Michigan Chefs de Cuisine Apprentice Program dinner and graduation celebration on June 19th.
- The Alpha Omicron Xi chapter of Phi Theta Kappa along with community members worked with faculty from the Biology Department to restore the nature trails at the Orchard Ridge Campus on June 16, 30 and July 14.
- The Orchard Ridge Campus hosted the fourth annual SUCCESS program for 9th graders from Farmington Schools. This innovative summer program in career and college success is co-taught by instructors from Farmington schools and counseling faculty at OCC.
- Royal Oak and Auburn Hills hosted a six-session Transition program for people interested in attending college.
- The Information Technology Department has instituted a new registration status program which displays up to the minute registration information.
