SUBJECT: DC3 OCLC Tape Load into NOTIS
DATE: June 16, 1986

After reviewing the current status of the DC3 OCLC tapes with Anaclare Evans, I think we could load them into a test file on our NOTIS system fairly easily. We could use the NOTIS vanilla loader program after adding the hospitals' OCLC holder codes to it.

The resulting initial test database for the hospitals would have records for all titles cataloged by the DC3 through December, 1985, including those of hospitals who have stopped using the services of DC3. See attached list of DC3 participants. The approximately 26,000 records would be for monographs, classed serials, and non-book materials. No periodicals would be included.

The DC3 records through 1984 have had duplicates removed and headings flipped to the then-current AACR2 form. Records for 1985 to the present could be de-duped by the DC3 staff after loading into NOTIS, if desired for a test database. The DC3 currently receives its OCLC archive tapes every six months. These additional 4,000 records could also be added to the hospital test database twice a year.

Access to this test database could be provided via dial-up lines through the MERIT network. The ACF2 security system would have to be in place for "look only" access. Considerable work may be required to help the hospital libraries figure out how to dial-in using their varying equipment.

The resources required to mount and provide continuing access to the DC3 database are estimated to be:
