- * Dalnet membership
- * Dainet end users

DALNET MEMBERSHIP:

- * Membership will expand, become more diverse, and have levels (might go beyond libraries)
- * Some members, dissatisfied with service, may go elsewhere
- * Membership will continue to be desirable

CONCERNS:

- * Links may be tenuous
- * Is it [WSU] "vendor" like?
- * Outsourcing
- * Cause we work together since we are different

WE ASSUME. . . DALNET END USERS

(2)

- * They will be more tech savvy the more we give, the more they want,
- * End users may demand both electronic and traditional sources
- * They will be diverse in their level of tech expertise we need to meet needs of both ends of spectrum (gap will grow)
- * Users want access to full text at desk top use multiple sources not just home
- More remote users and even beyond metro Detroit
- * Users will bypass libraries
- * Users want unmediated access (but some will need a lot of help or turnkey info
- * (Role of multimedia will grow)

WE ASSUME... DALNET COST/FUNDING

(3)

- * Tech shift (client/server) will drive up staffing costs in tech areas
- * Costs to participate in Dalnet will go up and we might need entrepreneurial activities to shift costs away from members
- * As costs rise, funding becomes more restrictive
- * Users may have to pay for information
- * Tech costs will rise faster than our revenues more of Dalnet members budgets will go to tech
- * Cooperative resource sharing might free up funding for other endeavors

WE ASSUME... LIBRARY AND INFO TECHNOLOGY TRENDS

(4)

- * Training for Librarians/Staff will be different and we'll need more
- * Speed of change will accelerate; escalating spread of internet, WWW, and electronic, digitized info will drive info technology (but not stable)
- * Different formats of info
- * Libraries will become producers of info (repackaging, massage)
- * More direct service from commercial info providers to users in competition with library
- *? Client/Server technology will make local systems more cost effective for individual members
- * Distance education and other changes will force changes in info delivery
- * Info tech costs will consume more of our budgets
