## Business Team Wins Invitational

Final judging of the inaugural Harding University Invitational Business Games was conducted Friday, November 18 on the Harding

campus. Michigan Christian College placed first in the Industry III division.

Fifteen teams in three industries participated during the eight-week competition which began September 16, with five teams in each industry. Ten high schools and five junior colleges from nine states and Canada were represented.

During the two-month competition, each team made eight sets of decisions, representing a two-year (eight quarters) period of time. Decisions included product marketing, unit producing, inventory financing and other decisions necessary for a normal business operation.

The Invitational Business Games relied on a specialized business game developed by Dr. David Burks, dean of the School of Business and director of the American Studies Program at Harding.

"These computer-simulated games have proven effective in providing students with decision making experience and in allowing them to bridge the gap between textbook learning and real-world situations," said Burks.

The Invitational Business Games were directed by David Johnson, assistant professor of accounting, who said they would now become an annual event at Harding.

MCC Vice-President Bill Fowler served as the team's advisor throughout the preliminary competition. David Briggs, business instructor, traveled to Harding with the team.

Team members included Susan Ward of East Detroit, Michigan; Don Tate of Traverse City, Michigan; Paula Coleman of Noblesville, Indiana; Rob Losher of Troy, Michigan; and Trish Stephens of Rochester, Michigan.

## \$223,000 Pledged to Support MCC

Over \$223,000 has been pledged to Michigan Christian College's Salary Sharing campaign as of December 1, 1983.

"It is exciting to see so many people willing to help," stated Rick Watson, coordinator of the fund-raising drive. "More money than ever before was pledged by mail. The Phone-a-Visit portion has generated over \$133,000 so far. It has been an extremely successful campaign. I wish there was some way to adequately express my appreciation to everyone who has worked so hard to help raise this money for the college." A final campaign tally is not yet available as pledges are still being received toward the \$250,000 goal. Also, gifts from companies which match their employees' contributions could raise the final count. (To find out if you work for a matching company, consult the list on Pages 4 and 5.)

The Salary Sharing campaign is a double-thrust effort, involving direct mail and telephone drives. The direct mail portion of the effort involves a "YES" response card being sent to the entire mailing list in early October. The telephone effort, known as the Phone-a-Visit phase, is a month long effort by volunteer callers to reach potential MCC supporters across the nation.

Five student volunteers raised a minimum of \$1,000 each of five nights during the PAV campaign. These outstanding callers were Mark

"We certainly appreciate all who called. The students worked especially hard. It is great to see their enthusiasm and interest. It is very enjoyable working with these callers on behalf of MCC," commented President Milton B. Fletcher.

# Message from the President



Dear Friends:

It seems impossible that 1983 is almost history. By the time you read this we will probably be writing 1984 on letters, checks and other documents. Just a few years ago it seemed that we would forever be getting to the point of writing 1983 or 1984 and certainly never the year 2000. However, that is only 16 years away. And for each of us, the time of life we have left is exactly the amount of time remaining until "eternity" begins. That fact causes me to pause and reflect on just how brief and fragile life is. But, Christians have a unique way to look at this business of life. We are just preparing for another one that will be so much better.

As we approach the end of a year, I wanted to say thanks to all of you who have remembered Michigan Christian College in your prayers, your gifts, and your moral support. Without you it would be impossible to continue to develop a quality program. We at MCC feel so very fortunate in having a clientele so dedicated to the concept of Christian education.

Let me express apologies to those of you whose checks have been late in clearing your bank accounts and, therefore, your receipts late in getting to you recently. We have just undergone a change-over in the computer system in that we have converted from our former computer system to a new Wang VS-80. This change has brought about undue and unplanned delays in receipting and responding. From what I am told, this is not abnormal, but that does not make it less frustrating. Certainly, your receiving our thanks and your receipts somewhat late is no indication of our lack of appreciation for your generous contributions. I'm just saying that we regret the delay and requesting you to have patience with us.

The Salary Sharing Campaign is almost over. The original direct mail portion of the campaign generated commitments amounting to \$88,641, while the Phone-a-Visit segment produced commitments amounting to \$134,266. To date, the commitments have totaled \$222,907 which is \$27,093 short of the budgeted goal of \$250,000. Therefore, we are getting out an end of the year mailing to those whom we were unable to reach during the phoning. We are hoping to see the total go over the top. It is such a vital part of our fund-raising budget.

We wish for you a very pleasant season and a healthy and successful 1984.

Each year, approximately twelve of these workshops are conducted at various congregations throughout the MCC service area. Recently MCC staffed workshops at the Bristol Road congregation in Flint, Michigan; Southside congregation in Terre Haute, Indiana; Northwest Church of Christ in Detroit; Valparaiso Church of Christ in Valparaiso, Indiana; and North Park congregation in Rockford, Illinois.

Over 2,000 have attended at least one of these sessions which are designed to encourage and enlighten Bible school teachers. Jesse Clayton, Director of Development at MCC, oversees the work done at the workshops. He is assisted in teaching by several of the MCC staff. Paul and Margaret Southern teach at every workshop. Milton B. Fletcher, Loren Gieger, Len and Fawn Knight, Larry Jurney, Coy Roper, and Rick Watson also teach at various workshops throughout the year.

Several excellent Bible School teachers not employed by MCC also teach. Betty Hutchinson and Edie Huckaby from Toledo, Ohio; Charlotte Roper from Allen Park, Michigan; Andrea Clayton from Troy, Michigan; Helen Cole from Plymouth, Michigan; Glenn Adams from the Bristol Road congregation in Flint, Michigan; Mattie Mitchell, Susie Hargis, and Myra Chambers, all from the Vinewood congregation in Detroit; Peggy Powers and Gordon MacKinnon from Birmingham, Michigan; Chris Panky from Cleveland, Ohio; Hollis McKinley from Fort Wayne, Indiana; Warren and Darlene Howe and Pete Peters from Dayton, Ohio; Kent Smith from Lafayette, Indiana; Charlie Herndon from Rockford, Illinois; and Chuck Thyme from Naperville, Illinois share their expertise.

"This workshop has been a real blessing to this congregation and to the church in this entire area," stated one Bible School teacher who attended a recent workshop. "We appreciate the work that MCC does in putting these workshops together."

## January is Financial Aid Awareness Month

January, 1984 has been proclaimed Financial Aid Awareness Month by Michigan Governor James Blanchard. A state-wide media emphasis hopes to help students with interest in attending college realize that there are ways to achieve their goal.

Michigan students should apply early for financial aid to guarantee the best aid package. A limited amount of funds will be available to Michigan students who attend an in-state private college. Application for financial aid in January or February will be necessary to secure a portion of these funds for 1984-85 college expenses.

Although the time factor is not quite as urgent for non-Michigan residents, they, too, should apply in early 1984 for best results.

Financial aid application materials will be mailed in January to all high school seniors on the MCC mailing list. Financial aid and admissions staff members will be available to help families complete the aid application. Dinners in Abilene, Texas and Cincinnati, Ohio had been conducted earlier in the year. Plans are to conduct similar dinners again next year as well as fund raising dinners in Indianapolis, Indiana and Tucson, and Phoenix, Arizona.

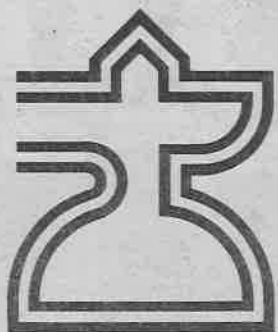
