College begins 33rd year guided by new president

"Change is the dynamic of every organization," stated Dr. Ken Johnson as he began the thirty-third session of Michigan Christian College at an opening meeting for employees. Dr. Johnson set the pace for the new academic year as well as a new era of service for the college as he shared his goals and dreams for the future.

Based upon his impressions of a preliminary survey report by Clark Dickerson and Associates, Dr. Johnson outlined three pressing needs that he plans to make priorities in coming months. First, he stated his commitment to adding the fourth year to the business program. Second, he discussed plans for giving the campus a facelift; and third, he emphasized the need to find new sources of funding to accomplish the first two goals.

As a first phase to campus improvements, Dr. Johnson announced plans to renovate common space areas. He stated that adjustments in the current budget would make possible immediate improvements to the lobbies of the residence halls. He also unveiled plans for a Spring Service Encampment that would carry with it a goal of refurbishing the entire campus within a two-year period.

At the opening session, Dr. Johnson introduced Candace

Cain as the new dean of students. He told of her background in student services, as well as her experience as an interior decorator, which will allow her to play a key role in campus renovation projects. Dr. Johnson also announced the selection of Garth Pleasant as athletic director.

Other new employees introduced included Penny Berta, development secretary; Lesta Gear, instructor of office information systems and assistant director of the Child Development Center; Gordon MacKinnon, adjunct instructor of psychology and sociology; Toby Osburn, adjunct instructor of Bible; Debi Rutledge, admissions secretary; Geneva Sparks, library assistant; Gary Turner, instructor of mathematics; and Vivian Turner, supervisor of boarding women. Dean Knight also announced the promotion of Sandra Hollis to director of library services.

Before ending his comments, Dr. Johnson expressed his commitment to the college and shared his belief that small colleges need long-term presidents to dream, lead, and implement. As changes occur, he stated his desire that some things not change, including MCC's "purpose, mission, focus on the Kingdom, support of churches, and love for youth."

Trustees and legislature honor retiring president

Based upon his successful presidency and willingness to continue working with Michigan Christian College on a part-time basis, Dr. Milton B. Fletcher has been named as chancellor of the college by the Board of Trustees. In his new role, Dr. Fletcher will assist with public relations, estate planning, and annual-fund dinners in the South. He also will spend seven weeks in Michigan during the summer, conducting golf classics and assisting with special projects.

At a farewell dinner hosted by the college employees, Dr. Ed Blews, president of the Association of Independent Colleges and Universities of Michigan, presented a concurrent resolution of the Michigan Legislature honoring Dr. Fletcher for his years of leadership.

The resolution stated, "Under Dr. Fletcher's insightful and inspired leadership, Michigan Christian College has advanced its reputation as a quality college. It has contributed significantly to the educational and moral fiber of our society."

Commenting on Dr. Fletcher's past work and his new role, Dr. Ken Johnson stated,

"I am tremendously pleased at the willingness of Dr. Fletcher to continue to work with MCC. He is loved and respected by all of our alumni and friends, and can continue to render extremely valuable service to the school in years to come."

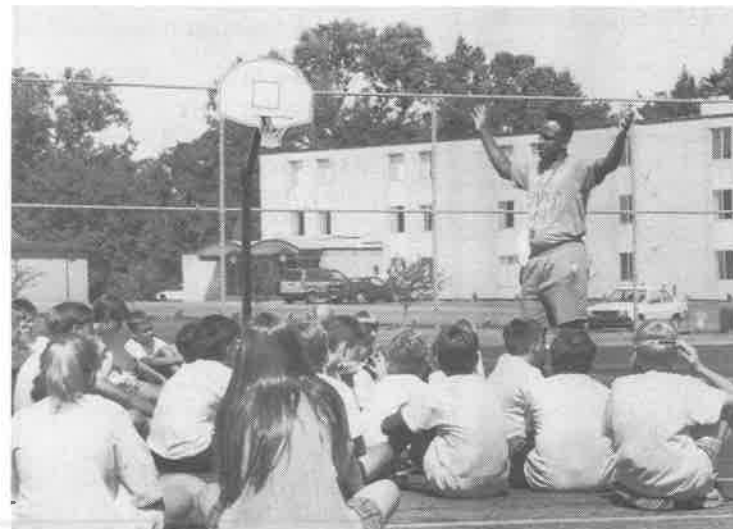

ucts sold by the Bookstore.


Anyone with creative ideas is encouraged to submit designs for consideration. Although concept sketches will be accepted, artwork should be perfected as much as possible.

Worth Repeating

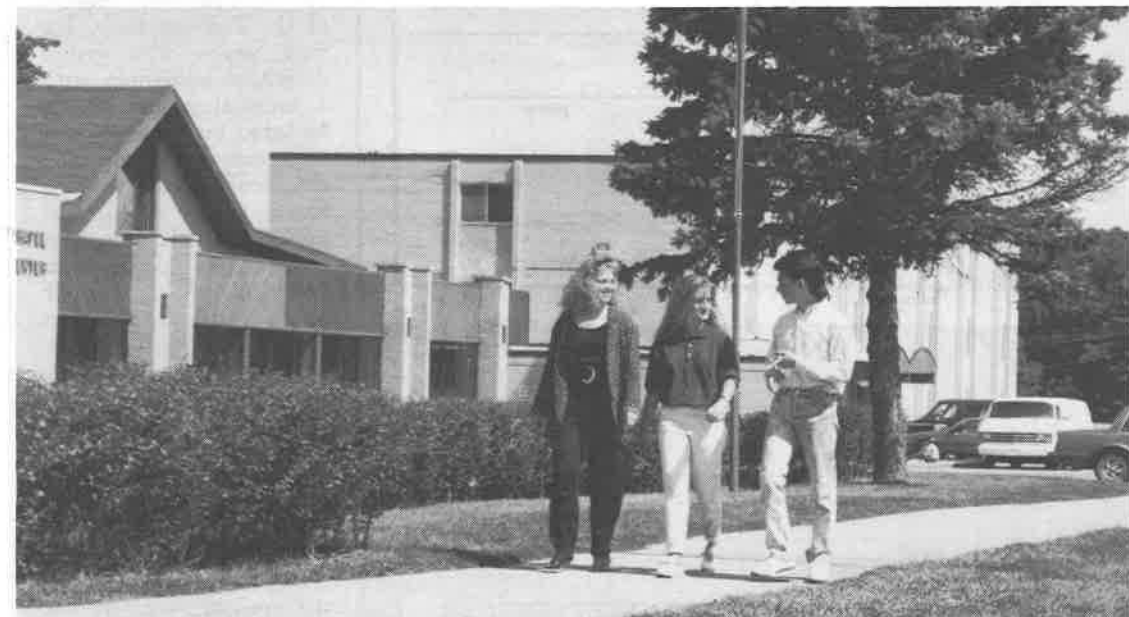
Following one of the Sunshine Rallies sponsored by Michigan Christian College, the president received a letter from a parent. Some of her words are worth repeating.
