For over twenty years, students have watched the campus expand around the lakes and gardens of the former Maxon estate. The Oriental Garden, located next to the former mansion, has remained a favorite spot for pictures. However, the pools in the garden have been inoperative for the past twelve years.

Shortly before graduation, the Student Body Association sponsored a restoration project in the Oriental Garden, providing volunteer labor as well as about \$800 in materials. Under the direction of Norm Smith of Farmington, Michigan and Kent Piatt of Englewood, Ohio, the students patched and resealed the pools, installed new water lines and a pump station, and planted several new flowers and shrubs in the garden. Within hours after the pools were flowing with water, the first unsuspecting victims found themselves joining the goldfish in the pools!
