



Optional major added to Associate program in Secretarial Science

Students pursuing an Associate in Applied Science degree in Secretarial Science may now choose between three majors at Michigan Christian College. The Executive Secretarial major, which has enjoyed an excellent placement record since its inception, has been joined by General Secretarial and Legal Secretarial majors.

The Secretarial Science department

The Secretarial Science department offers four levels of typing and four levels of shorthand as well as such courses as Clerical Skills, Business Communications, Word Processing and Machine Transcription, and Secretarial Procedures. The secretarial degrees also include selected courses from the Business and Legal Assistance departments. Students may obtain extra elective hours in their program through advanced placement in the skills courses.

MCC's Applied Science degrees are designed for students who wish to enter the employment world immediately after two years of college. Students planning to pursue a Bachelors' degree in Secretarial Science may also obtain the proper foundation courses with an Associate in Arts degree from MCC. At a Glance

Nine students served as camp counselors and special representatives of MCC in ten Christian camps this summer. They participated in a total of fifty-one weeks of camping in Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, New York, Ohio, and Wisconsin.

Two additions to the part-time faculty will enrich the fall class schedule. Robert Ponder, who holds degrees from Harding University and Wayne State University, will be teaching psychology and sociology courses. Ponder operates a private counseling clinic in Caro, Michigan. Also, Andrew Borchers, a systems analyst for General Motors, will be teaching a computer science course each term. Borchers holds degrees from General Motors Institute and Vanderbilt University and brings with him a superior teaching record at David Lipscomb College.

Chemistry and physical science students will be greeted by a new instructor this fall as Keith Lovelady begins his interim appointment on the MCC faculty. Lovelady, a graduate of David Lipscomb College, will be teaching in the place of David Cole, while Cole completes his doctoral studies at Western Michigan University.

Autumn completes twelve-state tour

Autumn completed another summer tour on August 16, singing on fifty-seven occasions over a twelve-state area. An early summer benefit dinner in Abilene, Texas allowed the group to give performances in Missouri, Oklahoma, and Arkansas in addition to their regular summer stops.
