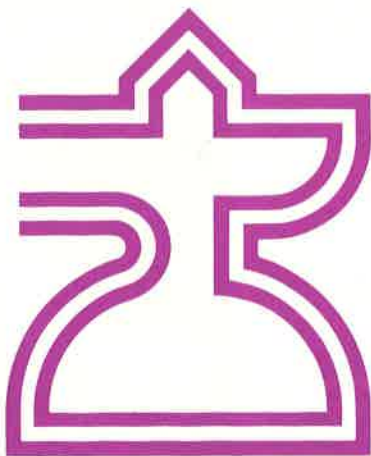

## Mid-season mark of 13-3 reached by Warriors after Homecoming victory

Students and alumni witnessed a 102-52 victory over ITT Technical Institute of Dayton, Ohio on February 4 at the annual Homecoming game. Hank Woodmore of Auburn Heights, Michigan led the Warriors in scoring with 28 points in the game.

The Homecoming victory gave the Warriors a mid-season record of 13-3 and marked the fourth time that the Warriors have scored over one hundred points so far this season. Other victories have been posted over Kirtland Community College, William Tyndale College, Marygrove College, Ohio Valley College, Siena Heights College, Mercy College, St. Mary's College, Madonna College, University of Windsor, and Grand Rapids School of Bible and Music. Prospects continue to look bright that the Warriors will play in the national finals of the National Little College Association for the third consecutive year.

Homecoming also provided an opportunity for honoring an MCC coed as the 1984 Homecoming Queen. The Homecoming court entered the gymnasium during the halftime ceremonies through a tunnel of candlebearers. MCC President Milton B. Fletcher then crowned Pam Whitelaw of Milan, Michigan as queen. Other sophomore representatives on the court included Jodi Jezierski of Troy, Michigan and Lisa Rosenbaum of Richmond, Indiana. Simone Hipkins of Joliet, Illinois and Lynn Howe of Dayton, Ohio represented the freshman class.

After the game, students and alumni returned to campus to prepare for the evening's banquet. The banquet centered around the theme, *Memories, the Way We Were*, as a part of MCC's twenty-fifth anniversary celebration.

Business related programs available in Oakland County received front-page coverage in the February 3 issue of *The Detroit News*. The article listed MCC as the area school with the second highest percentage of students in such programs.

Twelve choral groups from eight Christian colleges gathered in Abilene, Texas on January 13-14 for the Eighteenth Annual Christian College Choral Festival. After individual performances, the groups combined into a festival chorus of over 500 voices. En route to and from the festival, the MCC Chorus performed in Michigan, Illinois, Missouri, Oklahoma, Texas, Arkansas, and Tennessee.

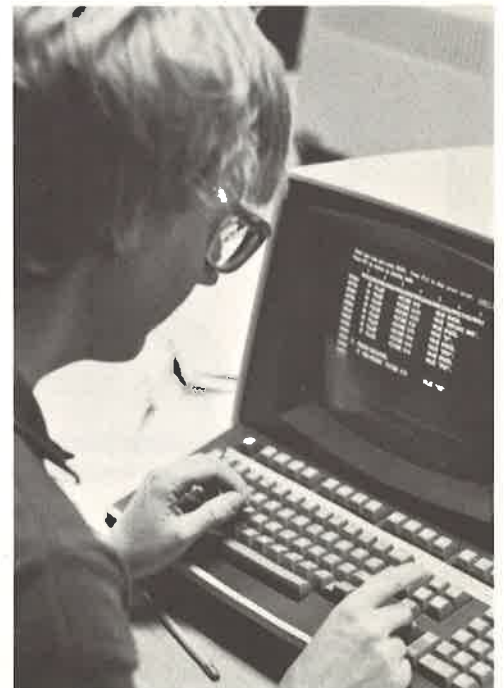

## New Cosmetology Management major available at MCC

Students desiring to prepare for cosmetology business management and ownership may now pursue an Associate in Applied Science degree with a major in Cosmetology Management. This degree combines business and general education training at MCC with professional training from a school of cosmetology.

In recognition of a cosmetology license issued by the State of Michigan or by a state with standards accepted by the State of Michigan, MCC will award a block of 23 hours of credit toward this major. The license must be valid both when submitted for recognition and when the student graduates from MCC. The license may, however, be presented for recognition within two years following completion of coursework at MCC. More information about the program can be obtained from the MCC Admissions Office.

The new Cosmetology Management major joins nine other majors offered by MCC for the student desiring to enter the job market after two years of college. Other majors include Accounting, Computer Information Systems, Executive Secretarial, General Business, General Secretarial, Homemaking, Legal Assistance, Legal Secretarial, and Word Processing. Students desiring four-year degrees in practically any major may complete their first two years at MCC with an Associate in Arts or Associate in Science degree.
