SCENIC CAMPUS. Natural beauty abounds on the campus of Michigan Christian College. Towering pines characterize the spectacular setting. CAMPUS FACILITIES. Ten major buildings are situated around the campus lakes. Athletic fields are located on the east end of campus. Approximately 80% of the MCC student body, which is represented by several states and foreign countries, live in one of four residence halls.

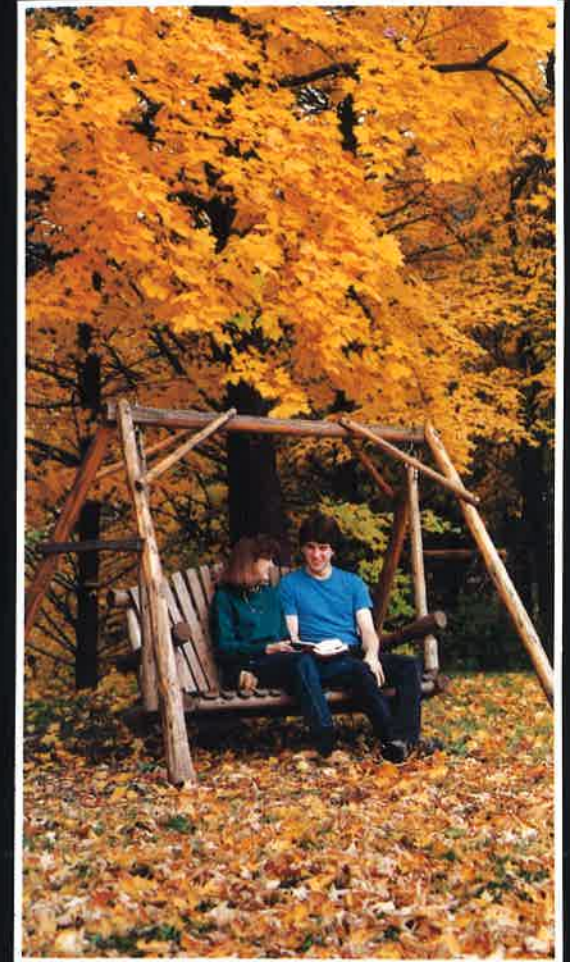
SUBURBAN SETTING. As you depart campus into the community, you enter one of Michigan's most popular suburbs, Rochester Hills. The area is known for its unique mixture of country charm and modern development. Shopping areas, theaters, and restaurants abound. Job opportunities in the community are so plentiful that many remain unfilled when they are posted on campus.

The strategic location of Rochester Hills avoids big city problems, yet permits access to the entire Detroit metropolitan area within an hour. Student groups often visit professional theatre, sporting events, museums, and concerts.

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Diverse Academic Opportunities

ACCREDITATION. Academic work at MCC is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools, assuring the ability to transfer credits.

PERSONALIZED INSTRUCTION. Your teachers know you by name and cause you to feel free to go to them for out of class help or personal counseling. Each offers the Christian perspective both in and out of the classroom.

BACHELOR DEGREE PLANS. A four-year program in Bible offers majors in Christian Ministry or Biblical Studies.

LIBERAL ARTS DEGREE PLANS. Since most colleges and universities require a basic core of liberal arts coursework, you may complete your first two years of most Bachelor degree programs with either an Associate in Arts or Associate in Science degree from MCC.

OCCUPATIONAL DEGREES. Those desiring to begin working after two years at MCC may elect an Associate in Applied Science Degree in Accounting, Administrative Assistance, Child Care, Computer Information Systems, Cosmetology Management, General Business, General Secretarial, Homemaking, Legal Assistance, Legal Secretarial, or Word Processing.

BIBLE CLASSES AND CHAPEL. Regardless of your major field of study, you gain from a Bible class each semester. Both students and faculty enjoy a special period together in daily chapel.

TECHNICAL COURSES. Those desiring a special course or two during their stay at MCC may take such courses at either nearby Oakland University or Oakland Community College.

MUIRHEAD LIBRARY. Over 47,000 volumes in a growing learning center help make up the library.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS. Regular admission requires either a high school diploma or G.E.D. certificate and formal application for admission.

THREE-TWO PLAN. If you have at least a B average and a composite of 21 or higher on the ACT, you may elect to skip your senior year and begin your full-time college program at MCC a year early.

LIBERAL ARTS APPROACH. If you are unsure about a major field of study, you are not alone. The liberal arts approach introduces you to a wide range of choices, while giving you time to decide which is best for you.

Meeting Expenses

MONEY IS AVAILABLE. No need to be afraid or discouraged with college costs. A large majority of the students at MCC receive financial aid, each averaging over two-thirds of the cost for a full-time, boarding student.

TYPES OF AID. Scholarships, grants, awards, loans, and employment are available from federal, state, and institutional programs. Although some scholarships are granted automatically on the basis of high school grades, most programs are dependent only upon your financial need.

HOW TO APPLY FOR AID. After your need is established on the basis of a standard financial statement, MCC will help you put together the means to meet that need. The aid office will blend the best package of available awards to help you attend MCC.
