Our program offers teaching certification in prekindergarten to third grade, third through sixth grade, and in learning disabilities.

PROFESSIONAL RESPONSIBILITIES

Engage in professional learning, act ethically, take responsibility for student learning, and collaborate with others to work effectively with diverse P-12 students and their families.

WHAT ABOUT MY CAREER?

Rochester University is authorized by the Michigan Department of Education to recommend teacher candidates to the state for certification.

After graduation and certification, elementary education majors can pursue positions in the:

- Lower Elementary Grade Band (Prek-3rd grade)
- Upper Elementary Grade Band (3rd-6th grade)
- Learning Disabilities

After graduation and certification, secondary education majors can teach at the middle school or high school level in the following subjects:

- English
- Integrated Science
- Learning Disabilities
- Social Studies

RU's School of Education is accredited by the Council for Accreditation of Educator Preparation and approved by the Michigan Department of Education.
