Subject:	Fall 1996 Enrollment Trends Report

Date: October 14, 1996

As of the official count date, fall term enrollment has decreased 5.7% over the last ten years and declined 15.1% over the past five years. Detailed information depicting these and student demographic trends are illustrated in the attached <u>Fall 1996 Enrollment Trends Report</u>. Highlights from this report include:

- The average age of fall terms students is 28. On average, female students are two years older than male students. Over the past ten years, the majority of fall term students have been between the ages of 19 and 20.
- Highland Lakes and Royal Oak/Southfield have the largest proportion of female students, while Orchard Ridge and Royal Oak/Southfield have approximately 10% more out of district students than do the Auburn Hills and Highland Lakes.
- The percent of minority students continues to grow. Over the past five years minority enrollment has increased from 15% (fall 1992) to 21% in fall 1996 (college-wide).
- In fall 1996, 80% of students are enrolled part-time. The proportion of part-time students has remained steady over the past five years. Furthermore, approximately two-thirds (62%) of part-time students are female.
- Student return rate (summer to fall) has dropped slightly from 39% in fall 1992 to 34% in fall 1996.



















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
Oakland Community College Trends in Sections, SCH & Section Size by Campus (Fall 1992 Through Fall 1996)


Oakland Community College Trends in Sections, SCH & Section Size by Campus (Fall 1992 Through Fall 1996)






Term Comparison of Student Gender (Winter 1996 Through Fall 1996)

Term Comparison of Student Ethnicity (Winter 1996 Through Fall 1996)






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



Term Comparison of Student Residency Status (Winter 1996 Through Fall 1996)

Graph 1. Student Mean Age






Graph 3. Student Modal Age 20.0 19.0 18.0 Winter 1996 Spring 1996 Summer 1996 Fall 1996


Term Comparison of Student Age (Winter 1996 Through Fall 1996)


Graph 1. Student Age for Winter 1996





Term Comparison of Student Return Rate (Winter 1996 Through Fall 1996)

Graph 1. Student Return Rate by Gender










Term Comparison of Average Seats and SCH per Section (Winter 1996 Through Fall 1996)

As of the official count date, spring term enrollment has increased 4.5% over the last ten years. However, in the past five years enrollment has declined 14.6%. Detailed information concerning these and student demographic trends are illustrated in the attached <u>Spring 1996</u> <u>Enrollment Trends Report</u>. A brief summary of this report includes:

- * The average age of OCC students is 29. Trends continue to indicate that, on average, female students are approximately two years older than male students.
- * Highland Lakes and Royal Oak/Southfield campuses have the largest proportion of female students.
 - The percentage of minority students continues to grow. Over the past five years minority enrollment has increased from 15% in spring 1992 to 18% in spring 1996 (college-wide).

In spring 1996, 74% of students are enrolled part-time. The proportion of part-time students has increased by 5% over the past five years. Furthermore, two-thirds (66%) of part-time students are female.

Student return rate (winter to spring) has dropped from 67% in spring 1992 to 62% in spring 1996.

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




Oakland Community College Trends in Total Enrollment by Campus (Spring 1987 Through Spring 1996)



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



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
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



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Oakland Community College Trends in Sections, SCH & Section Size by Campus (Spring 1992 Through Spring 1996)



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
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
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


Term Comparison of Student Ethnicity (Summer 1995 Through Spring 1996)




Term Comparison of Student Gender (Summer 1995 Through Spring 1996)


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
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
Term Comparison of Student Age* (Summer 1995 Through Spring 1996)



Graph 1. Student Mean Age




Graph 3. Student Modal Age






Term Comparison of Student Age (Summer 1995 Through Spring 1996)

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






Term Comparison of Average Seats and SCH per Section (Summer 1995 Through Spring 1996)
