

Executive Summary

Oakland Community College polls students who have not registered for classes in four consecutive semesters and who have not obtained a degree or certificate. Survey questions cover various subjects, particularly reasons for not returning to OCC. For those students who transferred to other schools, satisfaction with transfer procedures and academic preparation are assessed.

For 2008, 255 non-returning students were surveyed. Their results are indicated as follows:

- Over sixty-three percent (63.3%) of respondents (n=30) stated that their major reason for not returning to OCC as 'decided to transfer to another college or university'. Originally, 36% of respondents (n=236) stated their educational goal as 'to complete courses to transfer to another institution WITHOUT obtaining an OCC degree or certificate'.
- The most (19) non-returning OCC students are currently enrolled at Oakland University.
- More than seventy-eight percent (78.6%) of respondents (n=238) are currently employed. Of those employed, forty-three (n=186) are employed in a job that is 'highly related' to their OCC program and almost thirteen percent (12.9%) of respondents (n=186) use their skills learned at OCC 'all of the time' in their current job.
- The average (mean) salary reported was \$33,916.09.
- When asked if they would return to OCC, over fifty-seven percent (57.4%) of nonreturning students (n=235) responded they 'definitely would return'.
- Specific instructors were reported as the 'other' reason why some students did not return to OCC.



Satisfaction with Academic Preparation





- · 'Somewhat satisfied' and 'very satisfied' were combined to measure satisfaction.



- Make sure that there are no duplicate students. For 2008, the original file came back with 261 respondents. There were six duplicates decreasing the sample to 255 respondents.
- Questions 16 and 17 were on 1 four point scale for the mail survey, but a five point scale for the CATI phone survey. This problem should be corrected for 2009 so that the CATI phone survey is ar a four point scale.
- Salary:
 - For salary responses, several respondents indicated 20K instead of 20,000. All responses with text were removed for analysis.
