OVERVIEW

2010 marked the 25th anniversary year of the Detroit Area Library Network. 25 years of libraries working together to advance research and learning. A time to celebrate the partnerships we have built and the work that we have accomplished.

The celebration began with a luncheon and program commemorating the consortium's 25 years of incorporation. Invited guests included former DALNET employees, past Board chairs, and current members. Guests shared memories of the early years of DALNET and a slide show including an historical time-line was presented.

Throughout the year, a series of four DALNET Educational Forums were held in commemoration of the anniversary. Each forum was open to the public and covered a topic of interest to libraries and library workers. The series enlightened and excited participants, which included DALNET members and others from the community.

While celebrating the success of the consortium over the years, the DALNET Board was also cognizant of the current economic downturn in Michigan, at our member institutions, and in our communities. Through the leadership of the Board, DALNET was able to enhance delivered services, maintain stable cost-sharing models for the membership, and work within a reduced and balanced operating budget.

In its 25th year of operations DALNET looks forward to the future and the possibilities of creating new partnerships and strengthening existing relationships.

25th Anniversary Luncheon

On March 22, a luncheon and program was held to commemorate the consortium's 25 years of incorporation. The luncheon was sponsored by Sandra Yee, Dean of the Wayne State University Library System. PROJECTS

Union Catalog

After years of planning and implementation, the consortium successfully completed its union catalog project. All Integrated Library System members now share access to a single database. This project has allowed DALNET to streamline operations and standardize several system parameters across member institutions using the shared ILS. Completion of this project provides the consortium with greater mobility for the future.
