

# New Evangelism School Opens

PONTIAC, Mich.—The International School of Evangelism opened with nearly 50 students enrolled. Some from as far away as Pennsylvania and West Virginia.

Wm. C. (Bill) Hatcher, former instructor for six years at Sunset School of Preaching was the keynote speaker for this historic launch. He, along with Milton Fletcher, Vice President of Michigan Christian College

and Wes Whitt, minister of the University Drive congregation challenged the students and local congregations regarding this school for expediting evangelism in the North and in foreign fields.

The school is housed in the facilities of the University Drive church in Pontiac. It is located adjacent to the I-75 expressway in the heart of the North's strength, (one hour drive from 80 churches) five miles from Michigan Christian College, and is an ideal center for evangelism outreach. The building was built specifically to school code and is one of the finest facilities for a school.

The elders (Argyll Allen, Otice Palmer, and Joseph Priestley) of the 400 member congregation have been planning for a school of some kind for a long time. Hence, Nolan Crawford, first year graduate of Sunset in Lubbock, short term missionary to India, and founder of the Bristol Road school in Flint, was employed as director of this multiple phased program. Additional members of a qualified staff of instructors include: J. E. Alexander, Robert James, Cecil Shaw, Larry Smith, Wess Whitt, with Marilyn Crawford and Shirley Whitt teaching a wives' class.

The Detroit metropolitan area school has a broad base training program. It is a full time (30

training for other evangelism related needs. The school is fully licensed by the state and is seeking V.A. approval.
