2) Acceptance of Agenda:

4) Leadership:

- Chair Mary Ann McGee reported that the public commentary for the SSSRT redesign recommendations was scheduled to be an agenda item at the March CAS meeting. However, CASSC hasn't finished reviewing all the recommendations so this will be on the April CAS agenda and the report will be available for viewing on Infomart before the CAS meeting. The academic (ART) redesign recommendations are tentatively scheduled to be reviewed by the CAS at the May meeting. If the recommendations are ready for public commentary sooner, it may be beneficial to review them before the May CAS meeting because the May meeting is usually lightly attended due to some faculty teaching schedules ending in April.

7) New Business:

- Proposed SLRC/CRC Process

Karen Lee reported that the Curriculum Review Committee (CRC)/Student Learning Review Committee (SLRC) has been working on a proposal for the new Student Learning Review Process. She presented drafts of four documents that CRC/SLRC has developed to frame this process:

- Draft of Proposed SLRC Process – This document is a chart that identifies 9 stages for the following: Administrative Actions; Senate Actions; and Faculty Reviewer Actions. Note: “academic unit” refers to a program or discipline.
- Proposed SLRC Checklist for Faculty Reviewer – 13 items are being proposed for the faculty reviewer to complete.
- Draft of SLRC Review Cycle – The circle diagram outlines the five-year review cycle; the same information is included in the checklist.
- Draft of Proposed SLRC Questions – When academic units at OCC go through the Student Learning Review process, they will complete an online review report containing 12 questions. Question # 12 requires an SLRC Action Plan Form be completed for each issue that needs addressing. The form requests the following information: Issue to be Addressed; Action Plan; Accountability; Target Date; Support Needed; Cost Implications; and Follow-up.

**MOTION: To discuss the draft documents outlining the “Proposed SLRC/CRC Process” at the April Campus Senate meetings for adoption/amendments at the April CAS meeting. Seconded, passed.**

The documents presented above are also posted on Infomart and the SharePoint CAS website.

- Proposal to Re-Charge SOAC and CRC

Leslie Roberts reported that SOAC, CRC and CIC discussed the interrelated nature of their charges and a desire to streamline processes and improve communication and effectiveness of the committees at a retreat in the summer, 2010. Each committee (as proposed) will focus on annual and cyclical reviews and reporting of student learning for two different sides of the house. She highlighted the proposal which would require the CAS to recharge and perhaps rename CRC and SOAC:

- Name: General Education Student Learning Committee  
Charge: Ensures the annual and cyclical review and reporting of student learning in academic units not defined as programs.
- Name: Program Student Learning Committee  
Charge: Ensures the annual and cyclical review and reporting of student learning in academic units defined as programs.
- Background information, a list of potential advantages, and implementation first step were also provided.
- The major change is to focus on student learning; assessment should be part of CRC and SOAC.

**MOTION: To review the “Proposal to Re-Charge SOAC and CRC” at the April Campus Senate meetings for adoption/amendments at the April CAS meeting. Seconded, passed.**

- General Education Proposals

Marilynn Kokoszka reported that the ad hoc General Education committee wishes to present for Senate consideration three approaches or options to the General Education Distribution list as follows:

- Option #1 – Organizing General Education by OUTCOMES (rather than course areas)
- Option #2 – Organizing General Education by Distribution Area Requirements but including the outcomes beside the courses
- Option #3 – Organizing General Education around the MACRAO Agreement without reference to outcomes

When reviewing the options, the following questions should be considered:

- Should outcomes drive General Education?
- Should the Distribution List by content areas continue?
- Should OCC publish the MACRAO Agreement with or without outcomes indicated instead of its own Gen Ed Distribution list?

- What does a student need for General Education whatever his/her major?

The proposals presented are three different scenarios for mapping outcomes to Gen Ed outcomes. Currently, there is nothing in writing to give to students that identifies they have to have completed these outcomes in order to graduate. If a student earns a degree from OCC, we need to assure them that our curriculum imbeds these 10 outcomes.

**MOTION: To review the three options to the General Education Distribution list at the April Campus Senate Meetings for adoption/amendments at the April CAS meeting. Seconded, passed.**

8) Standing Committees:

- *Academic Master Plan/Shawn Dry*

Shawn Dry reported the following:

- He thanked Andy Hillberry and Chuck Flagg for meeting with CAMP to review the relationship between Information Technology and strategic and academic planning.
- In April, CAMP will meet with Facilities representatives to review the relationship between Facilities and strategic and academic planning.
- A report will be forthcoming that will summarize both conversations.

- *Curriculum/Mary Kay Lawless*

Mary Kay Lawless presented the following motion on behalf of the Curriculum Committee:

**MOTION: Request for a waiver of the 10-Day Notice requirement for the General Education Distribution List Addition of PER-1748 Group Exercise approved at the March 14, 2011 college curriculum meeting in order to accommodate this year's catalog deadline. Seconded.**

Rationale: Due to the emergency closing on Monday, February 21, 2011 the College Curriculum meeting scheduled for that day was cancelled, thus pushing the schedule back by one week. Waiving the 10-day notice for this meeting only will ensure catalog inclusion of the major curriculum proposal approved at the March 14<sup>th</sup> College Curriculum meeting.

**The motion passed.**

Mary Kay Lawless presented the following motion on behalf of the Curriculum Committee:

**MOTION: Request to decrease the 10-Day Notice to a 5-Day Notice for major curriculum action. Seconded.**

Rationale: The 10-day Notice used to be sent out via interoffice mail and the notice is now sent out via e-mail. Please note: 5-Day Notice refers to 5 business days.

Mary Kay Lawless also presented data on the percentage of Senate members that are likely to read and respond to the 10-Day notices sent out for curriculum action.

- *Student Outcomes Assessment/Leslie Roberts*  
A report from SOAC was available on the distribution table. Leslie Roberts highlighted the following information:
  - Faculty Assessment Days are tomorrow and Saturday, March 25 and 26, at the AH Campus in F building. Walk-ins will be accepted on the day(s) of the event.
  
- *TMC/Judy Matteson*
  - Judy Matteson gave a PowerPoint presentation to Senate – “AH Technology Request of TMC in January 2011.” The presentation answered questions regarding whether or not technological competency was a requirement for student success. IR sent out a survey to 1,220 OCC personnel. 355 responses were received from all 5 campuses and 7 different disciplines. Phase 1 was the survey; and Phase 2 will be the external research. The full preliminary report can be found on the Senate Infomart site.
  - Report from CMS subcommittee:
    - Purchasing has sent out the RFP.
    - Response deadline will be the end of April.
    - The responses will be reviewed in May. (ideally)
    - The decision should go to the June Board meeting. (ideally)
    - Pilot faculty can “test the water” for fall, 2011. (ideally)
  - Faculty Showcase:
    - Join us for Coffee, Crumpets and Cranial Stimulation on April 1, 2011, from 9:00 a.m. – noon at the Southfield Campus.

10) Ad Hoc Committees:

- *General Education Outcomes/*

11) Administration:

- Chancellor Meyer reported the following:
  - We are in a period of great change at the college regarding the budget, society and legislative.
    - An education reform will be coming from the Governor’s office in April. The Chancellor will provide more information when it is available.
    - There are indications that appropriations to community colleges could be reduced.

- The State wants to cut costs at universities and not move costs onto the students by raising tuition.
- Community colleges are valued in the State system; they are a critical component to higher education.
- There are some suggestions that community colleges need to be cut like universities.
- Dr. Meyer has a level of confidence that the Governor will do the right thing in order to preserve the quality of education.
- A draft communication plan should be available towards the end of the month. Infomart will have a new face – it will contain more information and be easier to navigate. Any ideas/recommendations are always welcome.
- Vice Chancellor Holcomb reported the following:
  - He attended a Department of Education meeting in Indianapolis yesterday and they were interested in what they could do to help community colleges. They are using the data we have collected and reported to them.
  - The redesign work is going well. There are 2 or 3 more SSSRT recommendations that need to be reviewed by CASSC. The recommendations will be in final format before they are put on Infomart. The SSSRT and ART recommendations will be posted a little differently than the administrative services redesign recommendations. The site will show a chain of events, comments and recommendations.
  - AtD (Achieving the Dream) – The core teams are working on strategies and how to move forward. OCC has created the following core teams: Developmental Ed; High Touch (0 – 3 weeks) and Special Populations.

12) Community Comments:

- Mary Ann McGee reminded Senate that elections will be held at the Campus and CAS meetings in April. Those present were asked to drum-up support and interest among colleagues because Senate membership should be all inclusive.
- Mary Ann McGee reported that a full report with the redesign recommendations from CASC is available on Infomart. Subsequent links to the SSSRT and ART redesign recommendations will be provided when the information is available.
- Nancy Showers presented a poster display on Achieving the Dream (AtD). This display was presented by the OCC team attending the Achieving the Dream Strategy Institute in early February at the Success Fair. She highlighted the following items on the poster entitled: “Achieving the Dream through Alignment:”
  - Student Thoughts on Success
  - How do we Achieve Student Success through Alignment?
  - Examples of College Engagement including the Staff Survey: Student Success Initiatives Inventory

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1. **ARC-1130 Basic Architectural Design I.** Change prerequisite to: ARC-1000, ARC-1040; or consent of instructor. Target date for first offering is Fall 2011.
2. **ARC-2111 Global Site Development.** Change prerequisite to: ARC-1140, ARC-1500; or consent of instructor. Target date for first offering is Fall 2011.
3. **ARC-2165 Interior Design and Color Theory.** Change prerequisite to: ARC-2050, ARC-2180; or consent of instructor. Target date for first offering is Fall 2011.

9. **ENG-1700 Reading in Areas of Interest.** Add prerequisite of: Placement into ENG-1510 or higher. Target date for first offering is Fall 2011.
10. **GRD-1750 Computer Design I.** Change prerequisite to: GRD-1100 and GRD-1120. Target date for first offering is Fall 2011.
11. **GRD-1850 Digital Illustration I.** Change prerequisite to: GRD-1100 and GRD-1120. Target date for first offering is Fall 2011.
12. **SPA-1511 Spanish for Medical Personnel I.** Change course description. Target date for first offering is Fall 2011.

<b>NEW COURSES</b>
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1. **HLS-1004 Terrorism Analysis.** This is a 3-credit course with a Group "A" Classification (35 students). Target date for first offering is Fall 2011. Course description:

"This course examines the phenomena of terrorism and its impact on the USA. The course examines the emergence of leaderless terrorism, a loose network of groups with common goals apparently acting in isolation towards similar ends. The course will conclude with discussions on fighting terrorism in the USA that include the potential loss of civil liberties and other obstacles."

2. **PER-1748 Group Exercise.** This is a 1- credit course with a Group "B" Classification (25 students). There is a \$10 course fee. Target date for first offering is Fall 2011. Course description:

"This course will introduce a variety of group exercises that benefit the student's wellness. The types of exercise that may be included are cardiovascular and core activities such as rope jumping, sliding, and other group exercise activities. Proper technique and fitness attributes will be presented for each activity. Course/lab fees."

3. **SPA-1531 Spanish for Medical Personnel II.** This is a 4-credit course with a Group "B" Classification (25 students). Prerequisite: SPA-1511. Target date for first offering is Fall 2011. Course description:

"This course, which is a continuation of SPA-1511, comprises the second half of the introduction to Spanish for Health Care Personnel I. The course will emphasize listening, speaking, reading and writing skills in a general sense (commensurate with other beginning-level college Spanish courses) and in the health-care setting in particular. Cultural components will be utilized as an aid in understanding cultural and societal differences within the Spanish-speaking world."
