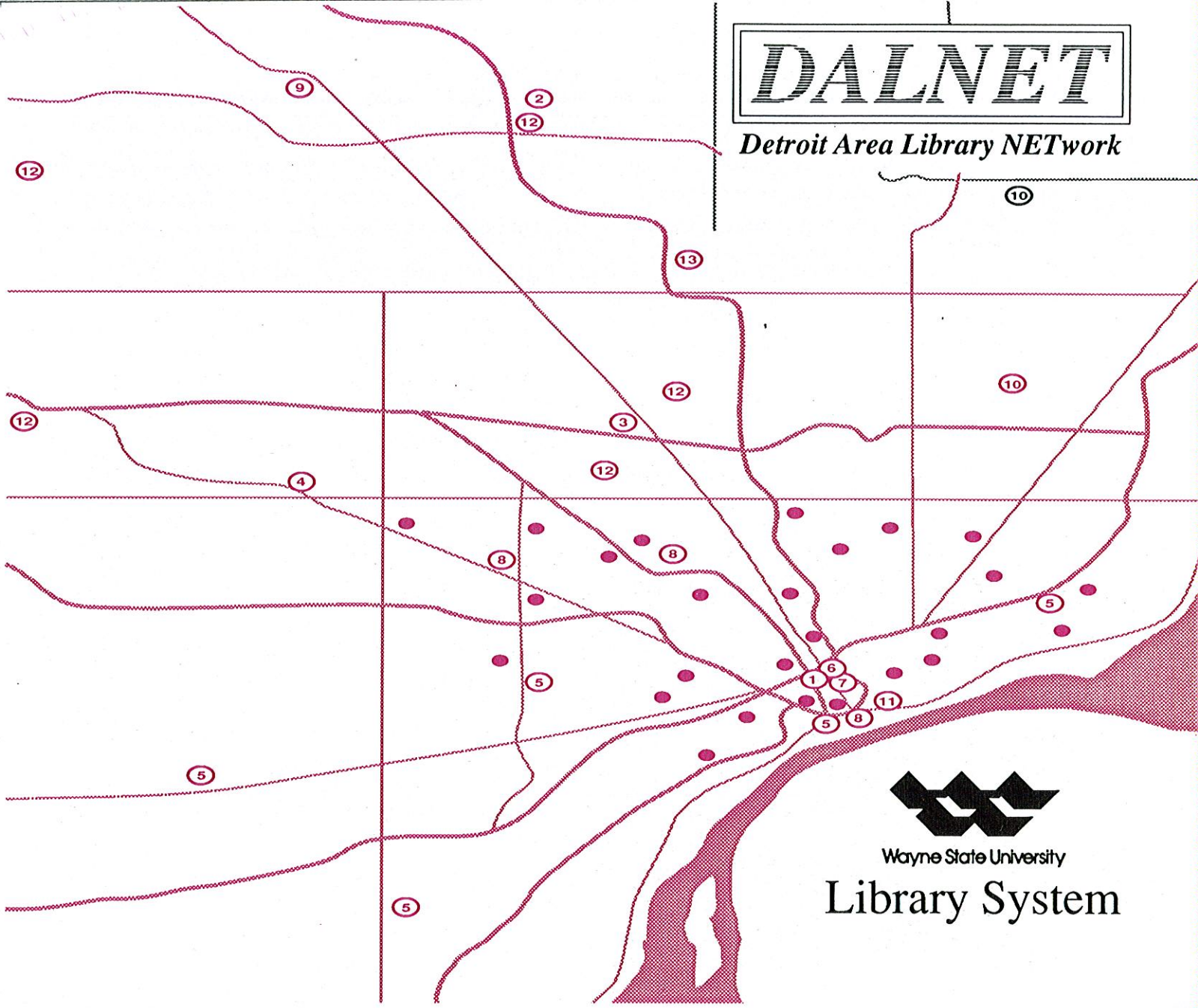

WHAT IS DALNET?

The Detroit Area Library NETWORK, DALNET, is a consortium of academic, public, and professional libraries in the tri-county metropolitan area that share a computerized library system owned and operated by Wayne State University (WSU).

DALNET GOALS

DALNET's goals are:

- to share the expenses of a comprehensive automated library information system that is more advanced than any single member library could afford on its own;
- to provide Detroit-area residents expanded access to the wealth of library resources available today through the use of this shared system.

DALNET POLICIES

DALNET is a nonprofit corporation formed in 1985 and administered by Wayne State University. DALNET policy is set by its Board, with officers elected annually for the positions of Chair, Vice Chair, and Secretary. Member institutions sign individual service agreements with WSU to participate in the DALNET Online System.

THE DALNET ONLINE SYSTEM

The DALNET Online System uses software licensed from NOTIS Systems, Inc. to provide state-of-the-art library management, database access, and collection sharing systems. The NOTIS software runs on dedicated mainframe computer hardware housed at WSU's University Computing Center.

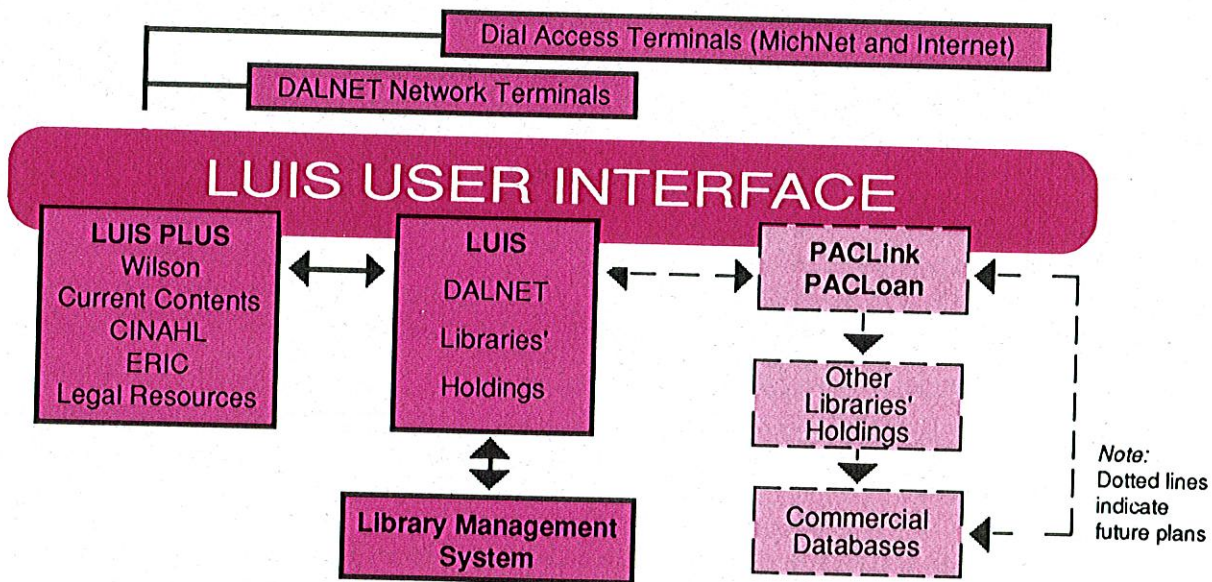
THE DALNET ONLINE SYSTEM

The **Database Access System** improves user access to library collections via the LUIS online catalog and LUIS PLUS index and abstract databases.

The **Library Management System** enables DALNET libraries to automate all aspects of library operations to better manage their collections. Operations automated include:

- acquisitions — manages ordering and paying for library materials;
- cataloging and authority control — creates and maintains the database of MARC records for library materials;
- serials control — records receipt of journal and other serial issues;
- circulation — tracks use of library materials by patrons.

The **Collection Sharing System** offers patron-initiated resource sharing with the PACLink and PACLoan modules that will be added to the DALNET Online System in the future.



LUIS

LUIS, the DALNET online catalog, has records for close to 4,000,000 titles. LUIS shows users which DALNET libraries have the materials they need, where the items are located, and if they are available on the shelves or checked out of the libraries. Users search LUIS with author, title, subject, call number, and keyword strategies.

LUIS PLUS

LUIS PLUS index and abstract capability was added in Fall 1991 and already provides access to more than 5.6 million periodical citation records that increase at the rate of 50,000 per month. Users search LUIS PLUS with the same user interface as LUIS. LUIS PLUS includes these databases:

- **Wilson** — covers science, social science, art, humanities, library science, and business journals, including those in *Readers' Guide Abstracts* from 1982 to date;
- **Current Contents** — covers over 7,000 research journals in agriculture, biology, arts, humanities, clinical medicine, engineering, technology, applied sciences, life sciences, physical sciences, chemistry, earth sciences, social sciences, and behavioral sciences from 1992 to date;
- **CINAHL** — cumulative index of nursing and allied health literature from 1983 to date;
- **ERIC** — covers literature in the field of education from 1983 to date;
- **Legal Resources Index** — covers legal literature from 1980 to date.

Databases available at each DALNET library may differ.

FUTURE

Plans for the future of the DALNET Online System include upcoming innovations in full text databases, image databases, graphical user workstations based on the client/server model, and gateways to additional online catalogs and commercial database services.

The **PACLoan** software will enable authorized library users to request books and photocopies of articles from DALNET libraries by filling in request screens on LUIS. This software will help DALNET libraries improve their document delivery services to users.

PACLink software will enable DALNET terminals to connect seamlessly to other libraries' online catalogs. Using the familiar LUIS user interface, DALNET library users will be able to search the collections of the University of Michigan, Michigan State University, and any other NOTIS site also running the PACLink software. Funding is being sought for PACLink to be the computer platform which will allow library users in Detroit, Ann Arbor, and East Lansing seamless access to Michigan Research Libraries Triangle databases.

BENEFITS OF DALNET

For DALNET Libraries:

- **A unique opportunity** to share in a comprehensive, continuously enhanced automated library system, that goes beyond what any single library could afford;
- **Improved management** of the wealth of library resources in the Detroit metropolitan area through computerization of library operations;
- **Increased use of library materials** to maximize investments made in area collections;
- **Cost-effective** online database searching through cooperative database licensing and loading;
- **Shared pool of human resources** with automation expertise;
- **Linkage** to regional and national library networks to expand access to resources beyond metropolitan Detroit;
- **Adherence to national standards** for computerized library data to ensure transferability to future computer platforms;
- **External funding opportunities** for library network participation.

For Library Users:

- **Electronic access** to the holdings of all DALNET libraries not only from library terminals but also from remote microcomputers dialing in from offices and homes;
 - **Up-to-the-minute information** about the availability of library materials, including circulation status, on-order status, and issues of journals received;
 - **Faster, more efficient** library services, including computerized checkout and prompt overdue notices;
 - **Easy-to-use** but powerful online catalog interface that, once learned, can be used at all DALNET libraries for both LUIS and LUIS PLUS databases;
 - **Electronic access to index and abstract databases** of journal article citations and other information sources;
 - **Saved time and effort** in identifying and obtaining needed library materials.
