Dear Ms. Auer:

As you may have been aware, Ameritech Library Services, Inc. was the wholly owned subsidiary of Dynix, Corporation. Dynix Corporation was in turn the wholly owned subsidiary of Ameritech Corporation. On December 15, 1999 Ameritech Corporation sold its interest in Dynix Corporation, and thereby all of the sub-corporations of Dynix Corporation, to a group of independent investors. The legal entities of Dynix Corporation and Ameritech Library Services, Inc. still remain as they were. As part of the condition of the sale the companies were not allowed to continue the use of the Ameritech name. Therefore, effective January 21, 2000 Ameritech Library Services, Inc. changed its name to *epixtech, inc.* Dynix Corporation's name remains unchanged.

The legal entity which was Ameritech Library Services, Inc. still remains, only under a different name. All contracts which were with Ameritech Library Services, Inc. remain valid and enforceable against and by *epixtech, inc.* As the legal entity is the same there is no legal requirement for such contracts to be assigned. In fact assignment would not be possible as one cannot realistically assign a contract to the same company with which the contract is already held. The most that should occur, if desired by you, is an amendment simply indicating that henceforth all references to the name of Ameritech Library Services, Inc. in a given contract are to be replaced by *epixtech inc.* In reality all that is needed is that you note the name change for your records.

I hope this has answered any questions you may have had.
