#### What is MiLE?

The Michigan Library Exchange (MiLE) eliminates the miles and time it takes to get the books you need, when you need them. Your home library is cooperating with over 100 libraries in Southeastern Michigan to provide access to over 12 million volumes. With three easy steps that identify you as a patron of a member library, search and identify the book you need, order it and it will be delivered to your home library. Day or night, use your computer, or visit any participating library and use MiLE at no cost to you.

## MiLE: Why?

MiLE is using the latest web technologies to link you to the catalogs of the rich library resources of Southeastern Michigan's public, academic, museum and hospital libraries -- enabling you to get books from many of Michigan's finest collections. MiLE is made possible by the Library Services and Technology Act funds administered by the Institute for Museum and Library Services and the Library of Michigan with the aim of improving library service to Southeastern Michigan communities and residents by eliminating time, cost or membership barriers. MiLE's participating libraries, and the library consortia through which they participate, are committed to sharing their resources in support of Michigan's commitment to education, literacy, a skilled workforce and lifelong learning.

#### **MiLE: Tomorrow**

MiLE's first year, beginning April 2002, offers access to books and related publications. In 2003, MiLE will also offer access to magazine and journal articles from participating libraries. Future plans include connecting MiLE to libraries throughout Michigan and the nation. MiLE's success depends on its value to you and your family. Let us know how you like it or any other suggestions you may have.

# **Privacy**

The MiLE system maintains personal information of valid users, including name and library card number. This information is used for the circulation of materials. Only current transactions are kept. Requests with a status of Cancelled, Complete, Expired, Undo, and Unfilled are removed after seven days. Information collected from the MiLE Web site is not made available to any other entity outside of MiLE except as required by law.
