# **DALNET FOCUS Session with Hospital/Special Libraries**

# July 21, 1995

Summary of comments/suggestions made:

1. What concerns or suggestions do you have about our current DALNET services, including training, communications, or technical support?

## Training:

- -- would like more formalized orientation program, e.g., half day, for DALNET Directors and Project Managers (both new and existing);
- -- need training for DALNET libraries staff on Windows, tcp/ip, connecting to the Internet, etc.
- -- need refresher training for NOTIS modules.

#### Communications:

- -- would like names of resource people at WSU to contact directly instead of funneling everything through DALNET Systems librarians;
- -- greater use of DALNET ListServ both for answers from DALNET Office staff as well as communication among staff in DALNET libraries;
- -- appreciative of communication via PROFS;
- -- would appreciate more advance notice on technical changes that might impact them, e.g., file changes.

## Technical Support:

- -- libraries need more LAN support;
- -- need help setting up GTO and label printing on LANs.

#### Other:

- -- DMC and DIA Libraries could use assistance for barcoding projects, e.g., pool of available part-time staff experienced in barcoding projects, expert to teach barcoding project techniques.
- II. What DALNET Online System enhancements do you need most within the next few years while we do our long range planning?

#### Databases:

- -- FirstSearch;
- -- IAC's Health Reference Center;

-- interested in joint purchases of databases--this might include a joint purchase with non-DALNET libraries, e.g., MetroNet and The Library Network (TLN);

-- Ovid version of Medline (prefer over Silver Platter or MDAS

search engine);

-- ability to connect to LegalTrak CD-ROM (and other CD-ROMs).

#### Full-text:

-- DocDirect.

# Location-based Catalogs:

-- most libraries want it to default to their institution; DIA prefers union catalog as default.

#### User Interface:

-- need a "front end" menu that enables access to LUIS and other systems, such as Web and local CD-ROM- based databases.

# Easier Movement between NOTIS Staff Mode and LUIS Downloading and Printing of multiple citations:

-- printing most important; download second.

## LMS Functionality Improvements:

- -- improvement needed for all modules and staff mode searching (see Attachment with Debbie Adams' list of suggested improvements);
- -- important for DALNET to send input to Ameritech Library Services on module "rewrites", especially cataloging module editing, acquisitions enhancements.

# PACLink, i.e., Z39.50 Hookups:

-- Michigan Libraries, e.g., TLN, MetroNet;
-- OCLC FirstSearch.

## Other:

- -- Direct system-to-system TLP to OCLC;
- -- Include Mosaic or Netscape as client on LUIS PCs.

III. How do you think our cooperative efforts built around a shared online catalog can best benefit your institution and your library users?

# Access to broad scope of resources:

-- "Seamless" access for users through a single workstation to more than LUIS.

## Resource sharing/cost savings:

- -- joint contracts for databases and systems;
- -- reduction of ILL costs, e.g., free ILL among DALNET libraries;
- -- reciprocal borrowing (problem for some institutions whose collections can only support primary clientele);
- -- cooperative purchasing, e.g., PCs;
- -- contract services, e.g., DCCC;
- -- escrow accounts to be held for member library's future purchases.

# Sharing technological information/staff development:

- -- resource people available in DALNET libraries;
- -- use of DALNET ListServ;
- -- continuing education and staff development for DALNET libraries (perhaps with other libraries in Metropolitan Detroit).

# Shared System Development:

- -- work jointly with vendors, e.g., Ameritech, to develop a better product;
- -- provide access to multiple systems, e.g., IAC.
