Dear Friends. The members of the Board of Directors, along with thousands around the world, were shocked and grieved at the sudden deathof Sister Alma Gatewood. Because of the seemingly few years she had lived on this earth and due to her ever-present and untiring energy, her passing was almost impossible to believe. The fact of her departure soon became very realistic, however, and as soon as opportunity permitted, the Board of Directors discussed fully what Mrs. Alma Gatewood had meant to the cause of Christ around the world and, in more recent years, to Michigan Christian College. We were all of one mind that Sister Gatewood had contributed so much of her life and effort toward teaching the lost and helping others that we, with one accord, sincerely desired to establish a permanent memorial to her and to her good works. President Gatewood requested that no flowers be sent to the funeral but asked that anyone desiring to send flowers might send a contribution instead to Michigan Christian College . . . toward the forming of a scholarship fund to help worthy girls receive a Christian education. The Board of Directors appreciated this but felt that Sister Gatewood was worthy of a more permanent memorial. It was, therefore, decided that a Girls' Dormitory be erected as soon as possible on the campus of Michigan Christian College and that this dorm bear the name of Alma Gatewood. The Board agrees that a permanent memorial such as this would be in keeping with her life and the best way in which the Board of Directors could say to President Gatewood and to all others how deeply we appreciated this fine unselfish Christian lady. This decision having been reached, the Board thus passed the resolution which you see on this page. BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF MICHIGAN CHRISTIAN JUNIOR COLLEGE

WHEREAS Alma Gatewood has served unselfishly the cause of Christian Education; and,

WHEREAS she has been a great leader of women in Christian thought in the Michigan area; and,

WHEREAS she has dedicated her energies to the training of young people, in the United States and in the mission fields of the world; and,

WHEREAS she has laid down her life in service to God, and particularly in service to the furtherance of the aims and ideals of Michigan Christian Junior College; and,

WHEREAS the Board of Trustees wishes to honor and perpetuate the memory of Alma Gatewood:

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Michigan Christian Junior College take necessary steps to establish and supply a memorial fund for the erection of the Alma Gatewood Women's Residence Hall, on the campus of Michigan Christian Junior College; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Lucien Palmer and Maurice Hall be commissioned to direct and to lead this endeavor to a successful conclusion;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the cooperation of the Administration, Faculty, Staff, Students, Alumni, Ladies' Associates, Men's Club, Century Club and all Living Endowment Clubs of Michigan Christian Junior College be sought to insure the greatest possible participation in this effort; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this project be pursued with all dignity, decorum, and diligence worthy of the great lady to whom the memorial shall be erected.

To this end we hereby give our approval, this eleventh day of February, 1963, and hereto have caused our seal to be affixed.


Mrs. Alma Gatewood, wife of President Otis Gatewood of Michigan Christian College.

To the memory of Sister Gatewood, the Board of Directors have resolved to erect a Girls' Dormitory. A sketch of this building, prepared by the college architects, Wyeth and Harman, is below. The cost in erecting this stately building will be \$200,000.00.

More than 250 people have already sent in contributions totaling more than \$5,000.000 toward this permanent memorial

to Alma Gatewood. Many others have stated their firm interest to do the same. These contributions are being specially handled at the college and all will receive receipts of donations sent. PHYSICAL EDUCATION BUILDING COMPLETED

March 5 saw the fulfillment of another much needed building on the campus of M C.C. The P.E. building had been under construction since September and it was a day of rejoicing to see it finished and available for use.

The building is of steel and concrete structure and in time to come will be brick veneered in keeping with the brick pattern being used on the total campus plan.

The building is 56 feet wide and 102 feet long. A legal size playing court (50 x 90) is included and a beautiful maple floor makes available a fine court. Later, a bleacher section for about 300 people will be added and a locker and shower room, also.

All in all the building is of great value in that it will make possible a well rounded academic program in physical edu-

cation as well as a very spirited intra-mural program. Possibly we could have built no building more appreciated by the students. The building was badly needed to make possible a better rating with accreditating agencies.

We are deeply indebted to the Ladies' Associates organization which gave \$12,000.00 to the project and the Men's Club which gave \$5,500.00.

The fourth World Evangelism Lectureship will be held on the Rochester campus of Michigan Christian College beginning March 31 and closing at 8:00 P.M. on April 2. The theme will be — "LORD WHAT WILT THOU?—THE TIMES — THE TASK — THE TOOLS." This inspirational period normally in cludes speakers from many nations of the world. Many outstanding and well-known speakers are already committed to participate in these lectures.

Panel discussions on current missionary problems will be featured. Forums on different world areas will highlight doors that are closing and opening.

A ladies' program giving insights into the woman's work on the fields will be directed by qualified missionary women.

The very popular "international meals" of last year will be repeated this year. Plans include a "Russian Day", "a German Day" and an "Asian Day".

For the first time this year, students and faculty members of many Christian college campuses will be present to present and to view challenges around the world.

Several outstanding missionary movies will be shown each evening. Devotional periods will close the day's activities. Housing will be provided for guests Meals will be furnished at nominal prices in the MCC cafeteria.

M.C.C. LAUNCHES SECOND SELF-STUDY

Another step forward toward higher accreditation is now under way. Application has been made to the Michigan Commission on College Accreditation. This is a separate accrediting agency from the State Department of Education. In preparation for the approval of this application, the Administration, Faculty, Staff and Board of Directors are jointly participating in a voluntary SELF-STUDY program. The study is to be completed by mid-spring and is designed to cause everyone connected with the college to take a good inner look at our entire operation. The goal is to more firmly establish our "purposes and goals" and to focus serious attention on the "strengths" and the "weaknesses" of the institution. It is hoped that the Commission will bestow upon MCC a high rating of approval and that these results will be available by graduation which is June 1.
