At the regular Quarterly Meeting of the Board of Directors on May 8, the appointment of Milton B. Fletcher as Vice President was approved. He will assume the new duties on July 1, 1965.

President Palmer said, "I am happy to make this announcement. Brother Fletcher has been productive in his work and has unusual dedication to Michigan Christian College and to Christian education generally. In a personal way, it will be a great pleasure serving the cause of MCC with him."

300 Students In September Is Enrollment Goal

Fred Alexander, Director of Admissions, and Dean Roy Palmer have announced an enrollment goal of 300 students for the Fall Quarter of 1965.

Student Work Contracts, government loans under the National Defense Student Loan Program (in which MCC participates), and an expanded scholarship program present a variety of ways in which MCC assists in helping students with the financial burden of a college education.

In anticipation of increased enrollment, a plan has been inaugurated to build a football and baseball field, tennis courts, and Student Union Building. Revamping and remodeling of present facilities to increase dormitory room for girls is also in the plan.

The Sixth Grade at North Hill school have been studying about Africa. So by invitation, Timothy, Berhane Habtayes of Ethiopia, Lancelot Choto of S. Rhodesia, and Stephen Okoronko were guest speakers to a combined assembly of 111 sixth graders and their teachers.

These and other very talented MCC students from distant lands have participated in various programs in Rochester Community schools and for public school teacher groups.

Requests from school teachers and principals for MCC foreign students to visit their schools next fall are already coming in.

Most of our foreign students are here on MTF (Missionary Training Fund) Scholarships. This scholarship fund is almost depleted, but it is believed that you who have given to this program in the past will resume on a regular basis again. Much good has been done through the MTF Program.

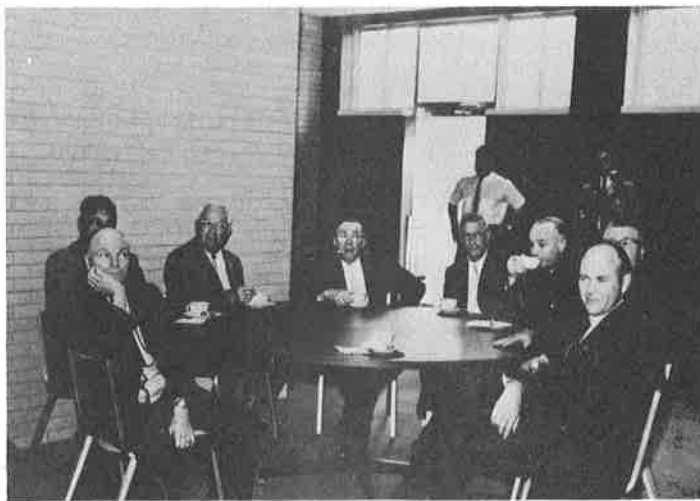
