1968 Lectureship "On Commitment To Truth"

11th Annual Series Slated for October 13-17

The eleventh annual Bible Lectureship at Michigan Christian College will begin at 7 p.m. on October 13 in the auditorium of the Rochester Church of Christ located a few hundred yards from the college campus.

Dale Smith, of Elkhart, Indiana, will deliver the keynote lecture at 8 p.m. on the subject "The Author of Truth". General theme of the week's lecture series is "On Commitment to Truth". Dan Woodroof, Associate Director of the Lectureship, said, "In an age when eternal truths are being challenged on every hand, when the first principles of the gospel and the simplicity and purity of Christ are thought to be out of date, the Lectureship Committee considers this year's theme to be challenging and timely."

Chapel speakers include Norman Adamson, minister for the Stoney Island church of Christ in Chicago and Carl Matheny, missionary to Beirut, Lebanon for the past

seven years.

In addition to Dale Smith, other evening speakers are Maurice Hall of Wichita, Kansas, Stanley Shipp of Abilene, Texas, Virgil Trout of Oklahoma City, and Jimmy Allen of Searcy, Arkansas.

Special sessions at the daily Luncheons will feature Virgil Trout in an open forum relative to Science and the Bible. Charles Brewer will be the featured participant at 2 p.m. daily on a "Know Your Bible" quiz panel patterned after the award winning television program in Nashville, Tennessee of the same name.

At 7 p.m. on Monday and Wednesday, programs of interest to all will include a variety musical program and Charles Brewer "On Stage" with readings and poetry.

Jesse Long, President of Greater Atlanta Christian Schools in Atlanta, Georgia, will be the featured speaker on Thursday at 6 p.m. for the Teenage Program of the Lectureship. Dr. Joseph Jones, Academic Vice President of the college, has planned a fine program for this hour.

ABOUT THE THEME

The Fall Bible Lectureship this year has been developed around the theme, "On Commitment To Truth." This theme was selected because we believe it to be timely, as always, and a theme which demands the attention of all honest people in our day of unrest.

Our brotherhood is disturbed. This is evident to all knowledgeable and thoughtful people. Many are already being classified, willingly or not, as either "liberal" or "conservative" even without adequate definition of these terms. It is certain that some, if not already, will become confused and discouraged to the point of giving up and taking leave.

It is hopefully thought, however, that we will have the ability and the faith to live with a commitment to truth which will keep us firmly anchored to the word of God. We should not throw away that which is old because it is old. Neither should we reject everything that is new simply because it is new to us.

We must communicate with the lost, but we dare not lose our perspective in a maze of dialogue. We must communicate the truth to the saved, too, but we must not impoverish the people of God with a view of retrospect only.

Our sacred trust is to communicate the word of God to the world, but as "vessels of honor" we must keep the message pure. As we speak we must "speak as the oracles of God". An understanding of truth and a commitment to it will enable us to maintain a proper balance in life. It will keep us from going off on tangents and from becoming so entangled with all the side issues that they become the main issues.

We must be committed to knowing the truth, speaking the truth, and living the truth in order that we might be rooted and grounded in the truth and, thus, grow up in Christ in all things.

You are invited, therefore, to attend this eleventh annual Bible Lectureship as much as you possibly can. Your presence will assist greatly in the success of this series.
