Michigan Christian College was especially fortunate last Thursday night to have Gundo and Helmi Vent for a piano-violin concert. The Vents are now on tour in America after a recent concert tour of Europe.

Both Gundo and Helmi are natives of Germany, and met at the famous College of Music in Cologne. They were married just last spring. At the College, both were singled out by the eminent Dr. Gunther Kehr, head professor of chamber music, to be in a special class of carefully selected students for training in repertoire. The College of Music specializes in training soloists, music directors, composers and music teachers.

PRENTICE MEADOR IS FEATURED SPEAKER

Plans are now complete for one of the most exciting High School Days in the history of Michigan Christian College. Highlighting the day's activities, on Saturday, February 22, will be two special adresses by Dr. Prentice A. Meador, Jr., Minister of the Church of Christ in San Fernando, California, and Assistant Professor of Speech at the University of California, Mr. Meador was in the Detroit area last fall for a series of evangelistic services and also spoke to the MCC students several times. His messages were enthusiastically received by all the young people who heard him. Professor Meador will speak at the 10:00 a.m. period and also during the afternoon assembly. Teenagers will be challenged and deeply moved by the messages of this competent educator and committed Christian leader.

Also scheduled for High School Day is a performance by the Michigan Christian College A Cappella Chorus, under the direction of Professor Ed Ritchie. Adding to the delights of the day will be a basketball game

between the MCC warriors and Detroit Bible College. For the final activity the Music and Speech Departments of Michigan Christian will present two short operettas, *Trial by Jury*, a Gilbert and Sullivan production, and *Sunday Excursion*, by Alec Wilder. Curtain rises at 8:00 p.m.

Registration and "Donut Hour" will begin at 8:30 in the morning, in the Cafetorium/ Gold Conference Room of the Multi-Purpose Building. Students and their parents and/or sponsors are guests of the college for luncheon. Several hundred students will be on campus for the day, according to Dr. Joseph F. Jones, Academic Vice President, who is coordinator for the High School Day program. The college will assist students from distant areas with Friday night lodging; but those who wish such accommodations should write Dr. Jones immediately about such arrangements. Missionary Student Tops Deans List With 4.0

The Dean's List for the Fall Quarter contained the names of three Freshmen and six Sophomores. Freshmen must have a 3.2 grade point average or above. Sophomores are required to maintain a 3.4 GPA.

Topping the list is Okona Etefia, a Sophomore from Ikot Ekpene, Nigeria, with a straight "A" average. Okona is at Michigan Christian College on a missionary training scholarship as provided by the KEEBLE-PALMER Missionary Training Program. This fund pays Okona's tuition, but Okona is working to pay for his room and board. This dedicated young man, as his grades point out, is a fine student and will one day return to his native Nigeria a well prepared leader in the church of the Lord in that country.

Due to the good response of many over the country, the KEEBLE-PALMER Missionary Training Fund is growing and the program is going well. "We are pleased that so many are having a part in "remembering" brother Marshall Keeble in this way", said President Palmer. The results of this program have proved to be amazing through the years and with an increased emphasis in upgrading the entire Bible Department, increasing effectiveness is promised.

MCC OFFERS GIFT ANNUITY AND ESTATE PLANNING PROGRAMS

In relation to developing a stronger financial base for Michigan Christian College, the Board and Administration have inaugerated a "Gift Annuity" program. A Gift Annuity is an agreement between a donor and the College whereby the donor of assets receives an annual income for life and the College becomes the recipient of cash, securities, or property from the donor.

In return the College contracts to pay a fixed annual income to the donor as long

as he or she lives. The donor may include another person and create a two life annuity at a slightly lower rate of return.

At the Annuitant's death, the principal fund becomes part of the Michigan Christian College funds for use as agreed upon at the time of the gift. There are several advantages to the donor when a Gift Annuity is purchased. In addition to the fixed

income for life which he will receive, a considerable portion of the annuity is deductible from Federal Income Taxes. Depending on the age of the donor, 60% to 80% of the income received annually is tax free; there is definitely a possibility of substantial savings to the donor in capital gains taxes, gift taxes and estate taxes when he or she established an annuity. The gift will ultimately serve educational purposes and the students of Michigan Christian, consequently the donor will receive that unique blessing that can come only from giving.




Elizabeth Hayes (l.) and Esther Kolu of Pontiac look over the paper instruments which will leave their estate to Michigan Christian College at their death.

The 40-member A Cappella Chorus of the college toured Indiana and Ohio during January 24-28. Concerts were presented in Fort Wayne at the South Side Church of Christ, the West Side Church of Christ in Yorktown, the North Central Church of Christ in Indianapolis and Bloomington, and the Southland church of Christ in Bedford, Indiana.

Afternoon concerts were also given in a number of high schools during the tour. The short, winter tour came to a close with concerts at the Clifton Church of Christ in Cincinnati and the Echo Meadows Church of Christ in Oregon (Toledo), Ohio.

MCC's A Cappella Chorus is well received everywhere a performance is given. Under the able direction of Professor Ed Ritchie, the group's repertory is varied from well known folk and popular numbers to the classical movements of Bach and Wagner.

The Chorus has a major tour planned for March and one for May, but itinerary is not yet complete. It is thought, however, that cities in Canada and New York state will be visited during the March tour and cities in Central Michigan and Ohio are on the schedule for May.
