MCC Dedicates Muirhead Library

(The following address was delivered by President Don Gardner on the occasion of the formal dedication of the John Nelson Muirhead Library.)

"There is a moving statement made by Paul in his last letter to Timothy. As he comes to close this deeply personal message, Paul instructs Timothy, "When you come, bring my cloak that I left in Troas with Carpus; bring the books too, and especially the ones made of parchment."

"At the time Paul was confined as a prisoner. Perhaps the cold nights and the cool days chilled this man and he wished to have his cloak. And what a cloak! It had been washed in the brine of the Mediterranean and had been stained by the blood of this living martyr. I can imagine Timothy making his way quickly to the home of Carpus in Troas urgently requesting the cloak which he might take to Paul.

"The apostle also said, "bring the books." He needed a cloak for his body, but he needed the books for his mind and soul. I am impressed that even an apostle, who was the penman of much of the New Testament, still felt the need to read.

"The library of a college campus is a nerve center. It is a place where learning occurs both on the part of faculty and students. A college is a community of scholars who are pursuing truth and who are learning together, whether as a teacher, an administrator or a student. So important has become the library in the minds of modern educators that they often

refer to it as a learning resource center. The library is no longer a mere depository of books. It is the home of filmstrips, magazines, records and other learning media.

"We live in a world of books. This is the age of paper and ink. They are even producing paper wedding gowns!

"Around 1500 the whole of Europe produced only about 100 new books per year. Today Europe is producing the prodigious number of almost

1000 books per day. This is not to say that each new volume adds to the sum total of knowledge but it does indicate that there is a knowledge explosion of great magnitude.

"The Michigan Christian College Library is yet a youngster with its 14,000 volumes and subscriptions to 250 periodicals. We must expand our holdings on a rather dramatic basis as we push for accreditation.

"Brother John Belasco preached for the West Dearborn church for several years and in that role came to know John and Alberta very well. We thought it appropriate that he reminisce for a moment about his ties with them."

\$10,000 Gift Recognized

Michigan Christian College recently received a \$10,000 gift for debt retirement. The donor has specifically requested that the gift remain completely anonymous.

Recently, Jim and Bessie Gallaher of Bay City, Michigan, made a challenge commitment to Michigan Christian in the amount of \$75,000 (article above). In order to bring their gift to total fruition, interested persons must contribute a matching \$75,000. The Gallahers have designated their gift pledge for the purpose of retiring some of MCC's outstanding debts.

The anonymous gift of \$10,000 will apply toward this matching program. An additional \$3,000 has already been contributed toward this fund and \$7,500 has been pledged. President Gardner expressed optimism that the complete matching fund will be in hand during this year.

MCC WARRIORS WRAPPING UP BEST SEASON IN COLLEGE HISTORY

The 1971-72 edition of the Michigan Christian College Basketball Warriors is quickly establishing itself as the finest team in the 13 year history of the school. The surging cagers from MCC are now 20-5 for the season, having won 13 of their last 14 games.

The Warriors continue to occupy first place in the North Central Christian Athletic Conference ahead of Fort Wayne Bible College from Fort Wayne, Indiana and Grand Rapids Baptist College.

The MCC boys had a successful trip to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, sweeping both games over Northeastern Christian College by scores of 105-91 and 115-102. The Warriors celebrated their victories with an exciting visit in New York City where they were housed in the Paris Hotel in Manhattan.


On Saturday night, February 5, the MCC cagers won a big conference game over Owosso College in Owosso, by the score of 93-74. The occasion was Owosso's annual homecoming game, but the Warriors were

equal to the occasion and never trailed in the contest.

Fred Harrison had a tremendous game with 30 points and 25 rebounds, and Steve Kerr played an exciting floor game with 29 points and many assists. Dan Miller, the 6:5 all-stater from Oklahoma City, continues to improve with each game and has developed into the finest center in the conference. In the Owosso game he scored 21 points, pulled down 15 rebounds, and blocked 8 shots.

The Warriors leading scorer continues to be Kenny Mims, the exciting freshman from Toledo, Ohio. In the St. Clair game Mims played less than half the game but scored 24 points.

The Warriors can clinch their first conference championship in the history of the school on Saturday night, February 19, with a victory over Concordia Lutheran in Ann Arbor. Everyone at MCC is excited about the approaching Conference Playoffs to be hosted by MCC at Rochester High Gym on the weekend of February 25-26.
