Students from nineteen states enroll

Residence Halls hummed with activity as Michigan Christian College's twentieth year began on September 3rd. A total of 323 students from nineteen states and five foreign countries enrolled for classes. They came to MCC from Arizona, Arkansas, Connecticut, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Louisiana, Massachusetts, Michigan, Mississippi, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Texas, Wisconsin, Marshall Islands, Nigeria, Palau, South Africa, and Truk.

Student body executive officers began their school year two weeks early with daily planning sessions on campus. They finalized plans for numerous student activities and set a fundraising goal of \$10,000 to be used in restoring campus landmarks from the original Maxon estate. Spiritual growth became evident in the lives of several students as the new school year began. Mission Emphasis completed their first campaign on September 23rd as a group of twenty-three students personally invited the residents of South Lyon, Michigan to attend a gospel meeting. A positive atmosphere on campus has already encouraged seven students in their decision to be baptized. Another thirty-six have asked for prayers at the Rochester Church of Christ. In the words of one student, "There has been a lot of talk around campus about this time in our lives being one of the greatest opportunities of our spiritual lives. I realize now that I can't pass it up.'

Chapel-Student Center Opens

August 13, 1978 marked the official dedication of the Westside Central Chapel and Utley Student Center. During the ceremonies, Student Body President Jay Crow accepted a portrait of L.C. and Elizabeth Utley, in whose honor the student center is named.

Beautiful windows forming a large arrow pointing upward highlight the Westside Chapel's view of the campus lakes. A unique seating arrangement allows for the dividing of the facility into three large lecture rooms within minutes after the closing of chapel programs. Immediate use of the chapel for registration, classroom space, chapel services, and weekend movies added to the excitement of the new year.

Two levels within the new Utley Student Center include a game and recreation area and a leisure area for visiting and television. Both areas have decks overlooking the lakes. Funds raised by the student body of last year are helping to furnish the new student center.
