BIBLE L-102, DALE PAULS (2 credit hours)
BIBLICAL VIEW OF THE FUTURE — Includes intermediate state of the dead, interpretation of prophecy, Matthew 24, the Jews and Palestine, the Anti-Christ, the tribulation and Armageddon, the resurrection and the rapture, the millenium and the eternal state. Theories of premillennialism and dispensation will be examined and refuted.

BIBLE L-122, TERRY BLAKE (2 credit hours)
EZEKIEL AND DANIEL — This textual study emphasizes the symbolic nature of prophecy as well as its contemporary message, laying a foundation for a better understanding of the book of Revelation.

COMMUNICATIONS L-112, GEORGE OLIVER (2 credit hours)
SHARPENING YOUR LEADERSHIP SKILLS — You will examine models and develop skills important to elders and deacons. Personal roles the leader has will be examined along with role-playing and the effectiveness of various leadership styles within the Church. This course is designed for men who are already leaders in the Church. Class size will be limited to 30.

SOCIOLOGY L-102, DEBBIE PAULS (2 credit hours)
THE ART OF FAMILY LIVING — Expecially designed for women, this study looks at the major areas for marital harmony and conflict while reviewing the Bible's contributions for a happy home. You can help yourself, help your children, or help plan a successful marriage.

ART L-102, LAJUANA GILL (2 credit hours)
CREATIVE CRAFTS FOR THE TEACHER — It will help to enhance the teachers ability to communicate through the medium of the visual arts. Items of interest will be macrame, rug-hooking, drawing and other exciting crafts.

BIBLE L-112, STEVE MILLER (2 credit hours)
YOU CAN TRUST YOUR BIBLE — Christian evidences as they relate to the accuracy and reliability of the Bible. Topics include evolution, the flood, historical and scientific statements of scripture, the resurrection of Jesus, and the transmission of the Biblical text through the centuries. It will help add to your faith.

COMMUNICATIONS L-102, DAVID KAHLE (2 credit hours)
DYNAMICS IN THE BIBLE SCHOOL — Practical workshops providing the Bible school teacher with dynamic teaching techniques which have revolutionalized the public school classroom, presented in an easy to learn format.

COMMUNICATIONS L-122, JIM BRUCE (2 credit hours)
INTERPERSONAL CHRISTIAN COMMUNICATION — You will learn how to overcome the barriers that may prohibit the effective communication of a Christian in a non-Christian world.

ECONOMICS L-113, TEAM TEACHERS *TENTATIVE* (2 credit hours)
PERSONAL FINANCIAL PLANNING — Learn how you can manage money effectively. Each teacher will have an expertise in some field of finance. Includes personal accounting, stocks and bonds, car buying, investments, insurance, and legal matters (such as the making of a will).

MUSIC L-112, JEFF GREEN (2 credit hours)
MUSIC APPRECIATION — Designed to furnish the student with a basis for intelligent and enjoyable listening. Introduces various types and forms of vocal and instrumental music literature. Great musical works frequently heard. Some emphasis will be placed on church music.

ART L-112, SUE JURNEY (1 credit hour)
PAPER TOLE — You can learn this beautiful technique of cutting and shaping prints of pictures that makes them come to life, several prints may be used including those of Anton Pieck.
