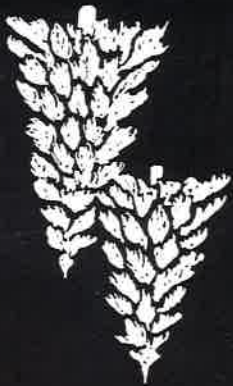
ON CAMPUS LIVING. Approximately 80% of the MCC student body, which is represented by several states and foreign countries, live in one of the college residence halls. The Alma Gatewood Residence Hall for women is built in a suite style, with two rooms adjoining a private bath. One suite-style hall plus the Campus Center and Barbier Residence Hall house men students. Living on campus in itself becomes a very special learning experience.

SUBURBAN COMMUNITY. Rochester, a rustic community in greater Detroit, gives you the cultural, educational, and entertainment advantages of one of the nation's largest metropolitan areas, while enjoying the peaceful privileges of suburban living.

HOMETOWN SETTING. Rochester, a thriving community of 8,000, boasts the internationally acclaimed Meadowbrook Theatre and Music Festival. In addition to its famous cider mills and unique shops, Rochester now serves as home to three new enclosed shopping malls, four shopping centers, five indoor theaters, and over thirty restaurants. Seventeen miles from campus brings you to eight more shopping malls and over fifty more theaters. Job opportunities are usually readily available.

WITHIN AN HOUR'S DRIVE. Metropolitan Detroit, with the nation's sixth largest city as its center, offers such places as Greenfield Village, the Henry Ford Museum, the Institute of Arts, Fisher Theatre, the Detroit Zoo, and the newly constructed Renaissance Center. Sports enthusiasts can witness pro-baseball at Tiger Stadium or Lions football and Pistons basketball at the 80,000 seat Pontiac Silverdome. Public and private golf courses, recreation centers, parks, and winter sports facilities are within reasonable distance for special outings.

Formal Learning Experiences

ACCREDITATION. Academic work at MCC is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

PERSONALIZED INSTRUCTION. Your teachers know you by name and cause you to feel free to go to them for out of class help or personal counseling. Each offers the Christian perspective both in and out of the classroom.

ASSOCIATE DEGREE PLANS. Since most colleges and universities require a basic core of liberal arts requirements your first two years, you may obtain either MCC's Associate in Arts or Associate in Science degree and then go into practically any field.

TRANSFER OPPORTUNITIES. MCC students have moved on to over seventy colleges and universities.

SECRETARIAL DEGREE. Those desiring to end their education after MCC may elect an Associate in Applied Science Degree in Secretarial Science.

THIRD-YEAR BIBLE. Bible majors may complete an additional year of intensive Bible studies at MCC. Plans call for offering the Bachelor of Religious ducation degree in the near future.

BIBLE CLASSES AND CHAPEL. Regardless of your major field of study, you gain from a Bible class each semester. Both students and faculty enjoy a special period together in daily chapel.

TECHNICAL COURSES. Those desiring a special course or two during their stay at MCC may take such courses at either nearby Oakland University or Oakland Community College.

MUIRHEAD LIBRARY. Over 30,000 volumes in a growing learning center help make up the library.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS. Regular admission requires either a high school diploma or G.E.D. certificate and formal application for admission.

THREE-TWO PLAN. If you have at least a B average and a composite of 21 or higher on the ACT, you may elect to skip your senior year and begin your full-time college program at MCC a year early.

LIBERAL ARTS APPROACH. If you are unsure about a major field of study, you are not alone. The liberal arts approach introduces you to a wide range of choices, while giving you time to decide which is best for you.



Meeting Expenses

MONEY IS AVAILABLE. No need to be afraid or discouraged with college costs. During the most recent year, 80% of the MCC student body received financial aid. Each averaged over \$2,200 in aid.

TYPES OF AID. Scholarships, grants, awards, loans, and employment are available from federal, state, and institutional programs. Although some scholarships are granted automatically on the basis of high school grades, most programs are dependant only upon your financial need.

HOW TO APPLY FOR AID. After your need is established on the basis of the ACT Family Financial Statement, MCC will help you put together the means to meet that need. The aid office will blend the best package of available awards to help you attend MCC.
