

Computer, secretarial, and homemaking programs supported by new labs

Six new majors in the Applied Science degree program are now supported by three new labs on campus. New majors in Computer Information Systems, Word Processing, General Business, Accounting, Legal Secretarial, and Homemaking join previously offered majors in Executive Secretarial, General Secretarial, and Legal Assistance. These programs are designed for the student desiring to enter professions immediately after two years at MCC. The labs also enable greater course selection for students seeking four-year degrees.

The Computer Science Lab features Wang terminals and a printer tied to the college's powerful new VS-80 computer. These terminals double for both computer and word processing applications. Several microcomputers, CPT word processors, and appropriate printers complete the new lab. The adjoining Office Systems Lab contains other secretarial equipment in a newlyremodeled room.

The former Gatehouse contains new lab facilities for Home Economics courses. The lower level of the Homemaking House features three kitchens and a dining area for foods courses. The upper level includes a lecture/work area for sewing and interior design classes.

At a Glance

Opening chapel on August 25 marked the beginning of MCC's twenty-fifth year of service. Late registration closed with a total of 371 students registering for classes. The enrollment represents a 9% increase over the previous year in the number of full-time students. The student body includes representatives from Alabama, California, Illinois, Indiana, Maryland, Michigan, New Hampshire, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Texas, West Virginia, Wisconsin, Antigua, Hong Kong, Surinane, and the Virgin Islands.

Afraid of transfering? An alumni survey reveals that MCC transfers achieve an average of 3.11 in their work after MCC. This year, Harding University's Time of Day features a student who spent his first two years of college at MCC, while Harding's Belles and Beaux features four MCC graduates. In academic and extracurricular areas, MCC students are well prepared for their junior and senior years of college.
