

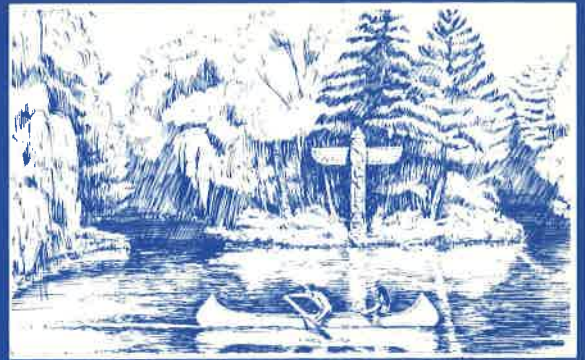

Theme of spiritual reaffirmation sets pace for 26th year

Opening Chapel on Wednesday, August 29 resounded with comments about spiritual reaffirmation as students and staff formally opened the 26th session of Michigan Christian College. Special speakers and activities of various campus organizations will highlight this theme throughout the new academic year.

New Student Orientation and Registration preceded Opening Chapel. Orientation included sessions on such topics as *Learning Support Services*, *How to Survive Registration*, and *Campus Life*. Students also had the opportunity to participate in various mixers and a reception.

Registration included appointments with faculty advisors, who were assigned to students according to areas of interest. Students then proceeded through the registration line by priority numbers set according to the date they applied for admission. Students registered from Arkansas, California, Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Texas, Wisconsin, Barbados, Jamaica, and Surinam.

Michigan is known as one of the nation's finest states for tourism. In keeping with the slogan of the Michigan Tourist Council, MCC students soon will have the opportunity to "Say Yes to Michigan!"

Meadow Brook Hall in Rochester will open its doors for a special "MCC Night" on September 11. Meadow Brook is the 100-room tudor mansion built by the widow of auto genius John Dodge.

September also will feature a visit to the Detroit Civic Center, including exploration of the Renaissance Center and the Ethnic Festival. Six days later, baseball fans from MCC will witness a game of the hottest team in professional baseball at Tiger Stadium.

Students will relive history at Greenfield Village in October as they view the world's

largest collection of 19th Century Americana. The Detroit Cultural Center will highlight November, as students visit the Institute of Arts and the Science Center, which features a movie on a unique domed screen.

A December visit to Frankenmuth will permit time for shopping in the world's largest Christmas store and the town's unique gift shops as well as time for feasting on famous chicken dinners. Autoworld, Flint's new indoor theme park, will highlight January.

Twelve acres of history at the Henry Ford Museum will merit a visit in February, while the animals of the Detroit Zoo will delight students on their final excursion in April. The entire series indeed will enrich the year for many MCC students.
