## New camp program scheduled on campus for summer

Beginning this summer, Michigan Christian College will be offering a new summer camp program for students in grades seven through twelve. Junior high week will take place from June 28 through July 4 and senior high week from July 5 through 11.

Campers will be able to select any two out of six activity options including basketball, computers, music, soccer, study skills, and volleyball. After breakfast and a devotional in the morning, campers will participate in a morning activity option. Lunch, an afternoon activity option, and supper will precede evening social events. Evenings will include outdoor games, movies, and programs before closing with a devotional. Meal times and social activities will be shared by all campers.

The cost for boarding campers will be \$150.00, which includes housing, seventeen meals, a camp T-shirt, and all activities. The full-day commuter cost will be \$100.00, which includes five lunches, a camp T-shirt, and all activities. A half-day commuter option is also available for \$60.00, including only one activity option and a camp T-shirt.

Enrollment in activity options is limited, so students are encouraged to register early. Although the registration deadline is June 1, spaces will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis. #### Warriors compete in national tourney after regional win

Sporting a 18-7 season record, the men's basketball team of Michigan Christian College earned a spot in the North Central District Tournament of the National Little College Athletic Association (NLCAA) on February 27-28. The team entered the tournament as the third-seeded team.

In the opening game of the tournament, the MCC Warriors faced Jordan College of Grand Rapids. An 87-82 upset over Jordan launched the MCC Warriors into the cham-

pionship game.

MCC played the host school, Jordan College of Flint, in the championship game. Although Jordan had a commanding fifteen-point lead early in the second half, the Warriors mounted a dramatic comeback. A layup by Errol Anglin of St. Catherine, Jamaica in the final moment of the game gave the Warriors an 83-81 victory and the district title.

The upset victory also gave MCC a spot in the NLCAA National Finals in Bristol, Tennessee. Participation in this year's national tournament marks the Warriors' fifth trip to the national finals in the past six years.

Errol Anglin and Dennis Spier of Suriname, South America served as co-captains of the team this year. Anglin led the Warriors in scoring, averaging 19.5 points per game, shooting 63 percent from the floor. Spier anchored the Warrior defense by averaging nine rebounds per game.
