A Cappella Chorus visits five states and Canada on tour

Visits to several attractions in Canada, West Virginia, and Ohio highlighted the recent Spring Tour of the MCC A Cappella Chorus. Their May 7-18 tour included fifteen performances in Ontario, New York, Pennsylvania, Ohio, and Michigan.

Before leaving Michigan, the chorus performed before about 1,500 people at MCC Partnership Dinner XVII at Cobo Hall in Detroit. After the tour began, a morning performance at Great Lakes Christian College in Beamsville, Ontario left the afternoon for a visit to Niagara Falls.

On Wednesday, the group traveled to Bethany, West Virginia and visited several historic sites from the life of Alexander Campbell. These landmarks included Old Main at Bethany College, the old Bethany Meeting House, and the Campbell Mansion. Campbell served as a leading influence in the American Restoration Movement for fifty-five years until 1866.

After performing at the Stark County Christian Academy on Thursday morning, the group visited the Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio and Quaker Square Shopping Mall in Akron. The following day included an afternoon at a park in Columbus. An excursion to King's Island rounded out the first week.

Performances in southwest Ohio allowed time for exploration of downtown Cincinnati and the Air Force Museum in Dayton. As the chorus traveled back toward Michigan, they visited the Toledo Zoo. An emotional final performance in Livonia, Michigan ended the group's year together.


