Counseling major added to four-year degree options

Since 1980, Michigan Christian College has offered the Bachelor of Religious Education degree. Until now, students have been able to select a major in either Biblical Studies or Christian Ministry in this program. Beginning this fall, a new major in Counseling will be added to the four-year degree options available to MCC students.

The new Counseling major is designed for students with an interest in personal, marriage and family, or child counseling. In the past, most B.R.E. students have selected a minor in Counseling since ministers devote a large portion of their time to that need. However, a number of former and current MCC students have desired additional training in counseling in order to prepare themselves for a full-time career in that specific field.

The new Counseling major features a core of thirty-nine credit hours in psychology and sociology, including an internship. Such new courses as *Biblical Foundations for Counseling*, *Child Development*, *Adolescent*

Development, *Psychology of Adulthood and Aging*, *Tests and Measurements*, *Learning and the Young Child*, and *Family Relations* will become part of the regular curriculum. In addition, the major includes a strong foundation of Bible courses to provide a solid base for counseling from the Christian perspective.

Although a limited number of counseling positions are available to those with a Bachelor's degree, most agencies require a minimum of a Master's degree. Graduates of MCC's four-year program have been very successful in graduate programs in the past. The new major will provide an even stronger foundation for those who plan to continue their training in counseling at the graduate level.

Sons and daughters of former students receive new award

Young colleges and universities look forward to the day when the sons and daughters of former students are old enough to begin their college studies. That day first arrived for Michigan Christian College in 1979, when Mary Blake of Littleton, Colorado became the first MCC student whose parents both attended MCC as well.

Since 1979, over sixty second-generation students have enrolled at MCC. They have represented such places as Arkansas, Colorado, Florida, Indiana, Illinois, Kansas, Kentucky, Massachusetts, Michigan, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Chile, and Jamaica. This fall, approximately twenty second-generation students are expected to enroll as freshmen, adding Arizona to the list of states represented.

In an effort to recognize second-generation students, a new Gold and White Award has been established. This award of \$100 is applicable to a student's first-year expenses. Students entering MCC for the first time this fall will be eligible to receive the award. New students entering MCC each subsequent year also will be able to receive this award.

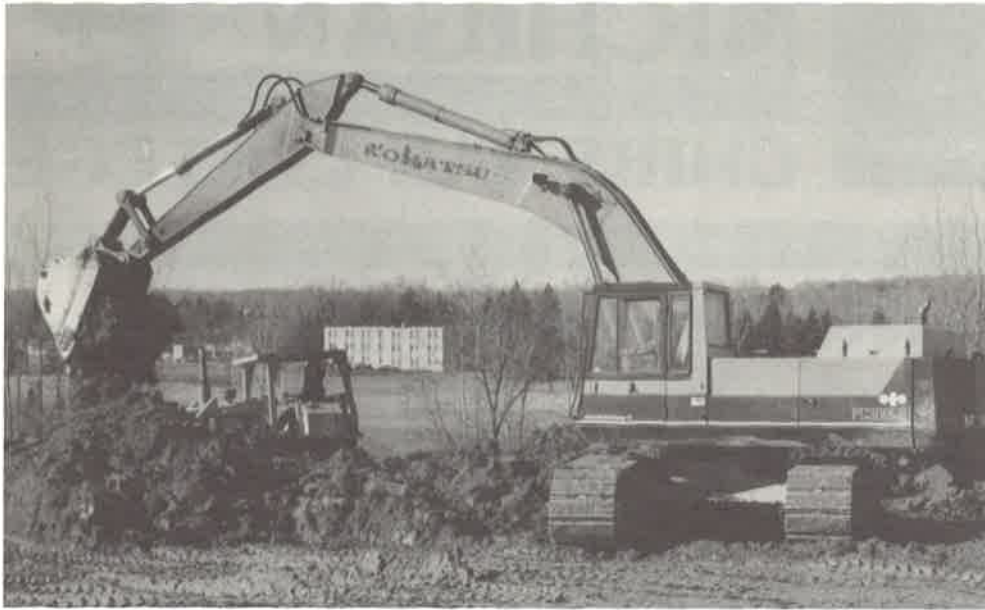
To be eligible for the Gold and White Award, at least one of the student's parents must have attended MCC full-time for at least one term. To receive the award, an applicant must simply name their father or mother when asked for names of relatives who attended MCC on question #36 of the Application for Admission.

Site work complete on neighboring construction project

Following months of delay in obtaining building permits, site work is now complete for a new facility for the Rochester Church of Christ. The Rochester congregation, which provides a church home for many of the college students and employees, purchased eight acres from MCC in 1986 for use in construction of a new building. The acreage is located on the southeast corner of the campus.

In addition to spacious classroom and fellowship facilities, the new building will feature a 1,000 seat auditorium. Special college activities such as the annual Bible Lectureship will be moved to the new auditorium. A large nursery will double as a Day Care Center during the week. The center will be operated by MCC in conjunction with an Early Childhood program which is being developed currently. The center will provide internship opportunities for students in the program.

Current schedules call for erection of the superstructure during the month of June. Construction personnel plan to complete the entire project before the end of the calendar year. Students attending MCC this fall will be able to participate in the formal opening of the facility.
