Small colleges referred to as a "refuge for education"

"Quality education has passed from our rich and prestigious universities to small liberal arts colleges." So stated a retired professor in a recent feature for *The Blade* of Toledo, Ohio. The author, Richard Taylor, wrote the article after 33 years of tenured professorships in large universities and nine visiting professorships in small colleges.

Taylor traced the development of colleges since the 1950's, when large universities began emphasizing research and publication. In contrast, he pointed out that small colleges "are still primarily dedicated to educating young adults."

Taylor contrasted his experience in the classroom. In the large university, he primarily conducted huge lecture classes and had his grading done by graduate students. On the other hand, in the small college he enjoyed limited class sizes and felt that he was better able to teach his students to think. He found more opportunities to touch their lives and help them to become better people.

As a small, liberal arts college, Michigan Christian College is dedicated to teaching and to providing a personal learning environment for students. Classes are generally smaller in size, permitting greater interaction with instructors. Faculty members are exceptionally qualified and able to know students by name. Year after year, they touch the lives of their students both in and outside of the classroom.

MCC Coach Pleasant selected as Michigan "Coach of the Year"

MCC Coach Garth Pleasant will receive honors at a formal dinner of the Basketball Coaches Association of Michigan on November 4 in Lansing. The association, which is made up of high school and college coaches throughout the state, has named Coach Pleasant as the "Coach of the Year" in college men's basketball. The previous two recipients of the prestigious award include the head coaches of Eastern Michigan University and Central Michigan University.

In twelve years of coaching basketball at Michigan Christian College, Coach Pleasant has accumulated a 238-82 win-loss record. He has taken his team to the national finals for seven of the past eight years, during which time the team has averaged an outstanding 22-5 record. Last spring, he led his team to their first National Championship, with a 25-3 season record. Coach Pleasant is known for his ability to create a positive, winning attitude in others.
