Board breaks ground for new construction

Anticipating an April start on actual construction, the Board of Trustees broke ground for a \$4.2 million residence hall complex following their last quarterly meeting. The construction project includes two residence halls, a campus commons, a new campus entryway, and major changes in roadways and parking areas.

"The whole face of Michigan Christian College will be changed by this project," noted Dr. Ken Johnson, president of the college. "We are in the process of completing the *Foundation for the Future* campaign, which is helping finance this project. As soon as we bring the campaign and construction project to a conclusion, we will begin our next major project, a new activity and athletic complex."

Responding to a broader array of programs at the bachelor's degree level, the largest number of students in two decades applied to Michigan Christian College during the past three months.

"We hope to have even more academic opportunities put together by fall," stated Elton Albright, Dean of Enrollment Services. "MCC personnel are working with two local colleges on joint programs in education and auto body design."
