### MCC hosts national cross country meet

Cross country runners of the National Small College Athletic Association (NSCAA) converged on the campus of Michigan Christian College on November 8 for their annual national championship meets. Upon arriving on campus, participants enjoyed an evening banquet, and then returned to campus the next morning for races in both men's and women's divisions.

The variety of terrain on the campus course provided an extra challenge for the runners. The men completed a five-mile route that included the level ground of the front campus, the hilly areas between the campus lakes, and the steep hills and dense woods behind the athletic fields. The women competed on a three-mile course through the same areas.

Concordia College of St. Paul, Minnesota, took first place in the men's division; followed by Michigan Christian College in second; and Dr. Martin Luther College of New Ulm, Minnesota, in third. Keith Roeder of Onsted, Michigan, led the MCC team by completing the race in third place with a time of 30:17. MCC's Keith Hinson of Nashville, Tennessee, took fourth place. Both runners received All-American medals from the NSCAA.

In the women's division, Dr. Martin Luther College placed first; Concordia College, second; and Michigan Christian College, third. Michelle Siegel of Wyandotte, Michigan, led the women's team from MCC by placing third with a time of 22:36. She was followed in fifth position by MCC's Vicki Bullock of Chelsea, Michigan. Both girls received All-American honors.





## New InfoTrac system acquired by library

Bringing the latest in CD-ROM computer technology to the campus of Michigan Christian College, the Muirhead Library recently added the Academic Index on InfoTrac to its growing number of resources. Consistent with its design for patron searching, the new system already has attracted heavy student use.

The Academic Index provides thousands of bibliographic references to over 400 scholarly and general-interest journals and the New York Times. Since it was created specifically for use in college and university libraries, the index covers a broad range of subjects, including the social sciences, humanities, general sciences, political sciences, and current events. The database is cumulated and updated on a monthly basis by the Information Access Company, providing timely information from the current, as well as the previous three years.

### At a Glance

Successfully completing a unique fund drive, the Student Body Association of Michigan Christian College recently sent \$7,000 to a Hillsdale family to assist them in the purchase of a chair-lift van. The family has three children who suffer from muscular dystrophy.

Pied Pipers, a children's theatre troupe, made their debut on campus during the fall semester. The group completed tours to a Kentucky youth rally and two Christian schools in Ohio during their first few weeks together. After performing for a graduate class in children's literature at Oakland University, the troupe began receiving invitations to perform in the local elementary schools.

Completing its first year of operation, the Child Development Center of Michigan Christian College is now operating at capacity. The preschool division regularly maintains a waiting list. A number of MCC students work in the center for internship credit toward a degree in early childhood or child care.

#### How Financial Aid Can Work For You!

Availability. Amounts available to individual students from financial aid programs have continued to rise over the past several years. Consequently, the average financial aid package at Michigan Christian College still covers over half of the cost for a full-time boarding student.

Aid Sources. Most students receive a financial aid package that blends various types of scholarships, grants, loans, and work programs. Michigan residents benefit especially from the \$2,150 State Tuition Grant, which can be used only at a private college in Michigan. Some funds also are reserved by MCC for students who come from other states.

Eligibility. College-funded scholarships and activity awards are available regardless of family income. Since all federal and state financial aid programs are based upon need, students with lower family incomes receive more aid. However, a current MCC student with a family income over \$69,000 is receiving some government assistance to attend MCC. Students who are not eligible for aid at a community college often receive aid at MCC.

No-Risk Application. Most colleges require aid reports from national processors that charge fees. MCC determines aid eligibility on campus at no cost to the student. Therefore, a student can explore aid possibilities at MCC without expense. In order to use this "no-risk" service, students should obtain their aid applications from MCC.

**Deadlines.** Michigan residents should apply for aid by mid-February in order to receive a State Tuition Grant. Out-of-state students should apply for aid during the spring months. Later applicants receive aid, but their aid packages include a smaller proportion of grant aid.
