

If the answer to that question is "yes," you should start thinking about Global Educational Opportunities (GEO) at Rochester College! Each fall, a group of students and faculty spend a semester in Vienna, Austria, and this very castle (called Schloss Neuwaldegg) serves as their residence—a home base for 14 weeks of European travel and adventure.

Vienna was chosen as a host site based on its well-preserved history and culture. Its central location also provides accessibility for train travel, allowing weekend getaways to Germany, Belgium, France, or anywhere else throughout Europe. Extended excursions in London and Italy are included in the group itinerary before settling in at Neuwaldegg as well.

Student travelers take between 12-18 credit

hours in the program, in subjects such as aesthetics/music appreciation, German language, mission experience, and fitness and wellness. Opportunities for spiritual development are also offered through daily devotional times and mission work at clothing and food distribution centers to refugees and shelters for children.

"The experience that GEO provides is incredible; there is no better way to learn," said John Barton, associate academic dean. "You learn more about yourself, history, music, food, politics, and more. Traveling cross-culturally adds an unbelievable dimension to a college semester."





Men's soccer team strives to defend title

The Warriors enter the new season with just one goal: REPEAT as National Champions! Last fall, the Warriors battled their way to a shootout victory in the 2006 USCAA (United States Collegiate Athletic Association) National Invitational Men's Soccer Tournament.

This season, head coach Rick Gutierrez says that the USCAA national tournament and national championship remain primary goals for the Warriors. "The core of last year's team has returned intact, and is already making a strong presence on the field. Everyone is excited with the play of returning sophomore goal keeper David Ristich, who was a key to the 2006 national championship victory." The team's 2007 schedule includes more than 20 games, plus the National Tournament, against fellow USCAA schools as well as NAIA and NCAA Division III programs.

RC basketball coach hits 600 wins

Head basketball coach Garth Pleasant reached a major milestone last year when he led the Warriors to his 600th victory, making him the winningest active college basketball coach in the state of Michigan. "What does 600 wins mean to me?" said Coach Pleasant. "It means that I've been coaching for a long time! It also means that I've had outstanding young men playing for me over the years. I will always be indebted to these men and to Rochester College." Coach Pleasant begins his 32nd year as RC's head coach this fall.

Volleyball season heats up

The Lady Volleyball Warriors enter the 2007 season with high expectations, hoping to build on a strong third-place finish in the 2006 USCAA National Tournament. While happy to have finished so well, the team is not satisfied.

Coach Dave Crump says he is very optimistic about the team's chances this season. "We have a stronger, talented team, more height in our front row and more depth, but we also have a stronger schedule, playing a balance of NCAA Division III, NAIA, NCCAA and USCAA teams. Our intent is to get out of the gate faster this year and to continue to climb until we peak at the national tournament. I have full faith that the team will deliver."

Golf and cross country programs return to RC

This fall, golf teams for men and women were added to the athletic docket for the first time. Clayton Bissett was hired as the coach for both teams. Athletic director Garth Pleasant enthused, "I have known Clayton for a number of years and there is no question that he will be a tremendous asset. He is a man of integrity and his work ethic is unsurpassed."

Also, next fall cross country teams for both men and women will return to campus after a five-year hiatus. Ron Keen, currently the athletic trainer for Rochester College, will head up the program. Keen not only participated in cross country as a student, but has coaching experience as well. Concerning Keen, Pleasant said, "Ron is one of the most organized and capable individuals I have had the pleasure to work with. He leaves no stone unturned."
