Management **Bachelor of Business Administration in Management**

The BBA in Management focuses on the most pressing issues facing business and industry. Students study international, domestic, and regulatory forces that impact decisions for executives of both large and small businesses.

Accounting **Bachelor of Business Administration in Accounting**

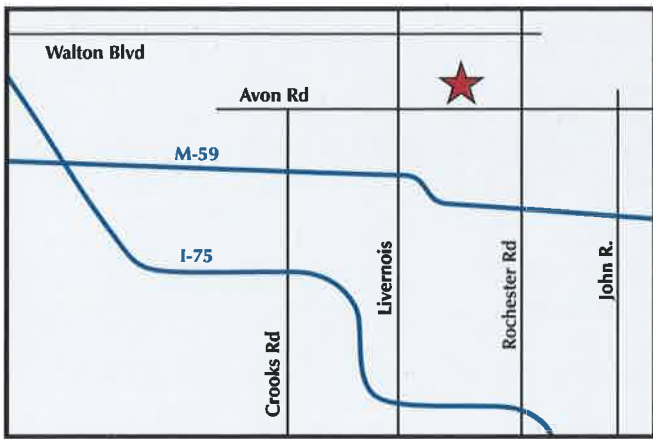

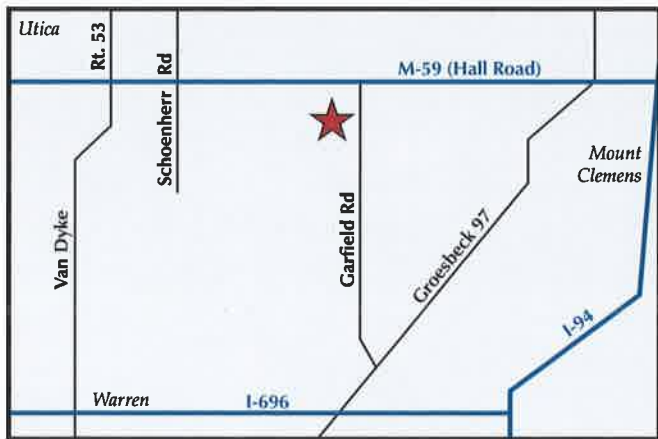

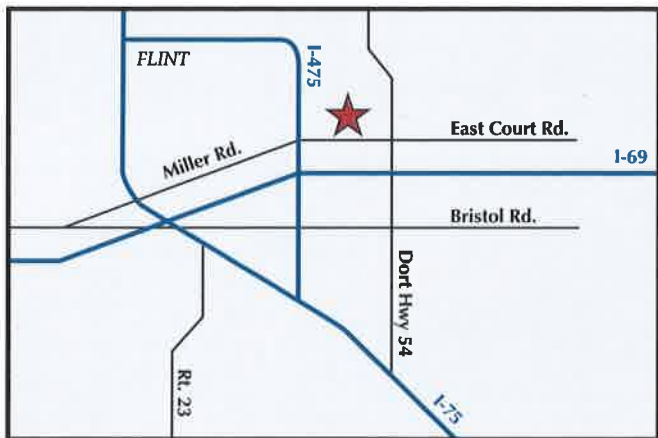
