

Program Description

The Bachelor of Business Administration with a management major degree completion program offers a broad-based and versatile education in business management. Courses focus on the most pressing issues facing business and industry today.

Collaboration with the business community helps assure that this degree program is both practical and valued by employers.

Within the Management Major you can select one of 3 different tracks. General Management Track, Human Resources Track, or Marketing Management Track.

Admission Requirements

Regular admissions to bachelor degree completion programs is granted to students who are at least 23 years of age or have 3 or more years of full-time work experience, and have a high school diploma or its equivalent with a minimum GPA of 2.25. Admission to the University Center programs is also granted to the graduates of the host institutions. All transfer students must have a GPA of 2.25 to be regularly admitted .

Flexible Scheduling

With accelerated classes in the evenings, on weekends, and online, Rochester College helps you step ahead of the competition. Classes meet once a week for eight weeks, allowing students who have finished their foundation credits to complete their degree in just twelve months. However, you can set your own pace. With Rochester College, stepping forward with your education doesn't mean falling back in the rest of your life.

Program Schedule

Classes meet once per week at the Main campus on Tuesday or Thursday evenings (6:00-10:00) and Saturday mornings (8:00-12:00) or Saturday afternoons (12:30-4:30) at both the Main campus and Macomb University Center. Classes meet at the Southfield location on Tuesday or Thursday evenings (6:00-10:00). Most courses meet for 8 weeks. There are two 8-week sessions per semester, and three semesters per year allowing you to accelerate completion of the program. Some classes are also offered online.
