



Rochester College is ideally located on 81 acres of suburban woodland dotted with lakes and bordered by the Clinton River. Its home is Rochester Hills, a city with a unique mixture of country charm and modern development that has become one of the most popular residential communities in southeastern Michigan. Numerous job and internship opportunities await our students at the more than 250 listed Fortune 500 companies holding operations in the area. Theaters, museums, professional sporting venues, upscale shopping and popular restaurants offer many nearby options for recreation as well.

FOUNDATION: In 1959, as North Central Christian College

LOCATION: Just 20 miles north of Detroit. Michigan's largest metropolitan area. In 2009 Rochester Hills was honored as one of America's Top 100 Places to Live by Relocate-America.com.

SIZE: 900 students (60% female, 40% male)

CAMPUS: 81 acres of grounds, with a natural lake and river that follows the path of the Paint Creek Trail

RELIGIOUS HERITAGE: Founded by members of the Church of Christ, with the desire to develop a Christian college in the northern United States.

FACULTY: 147 instructional staff, with 25 full-time and 122 part time. 44% of full-time faculty hold doctorate degrees.

AVERAGE CLASS SIZE: 15 students

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS: 16 majors featuring more than 30 different concentrations and tracks

MACBOOKS: New Macbooks are provided to all freshmen entering with fewer than 30 credit hours at the beginning of their first semester

INTERNET: High-speed wired and wireless available in all residence halls, classrooms, and common areas: wireless network across campus

#### GLOBAL EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES:

15-week study-abroad program based in Vienna, Austria each fall. Shorter subject-based programs are held over summer and winter breaks to locations including the western United States, China, Turkey, and Israel.

ATHLETICS: USCAA Conference in nine varsity sports; 35% of students participate. NAIA application made, with expected membership in fall 2010. Active intramural program.

COST: 2009-2010 tuition is \$15,792; room and board is \$5,496; total is \$21,288

FINANCIAL AID AND SCHOLARSHIPS: 80% of students receive aid in the form of scholarships, grants, and loans. The average aid package in 2008-2009 was \$11,372.
