## OK, MAYBE YOU KNOW THAT ALREADY. BUT DID YOU KNOW...


At Rochester College, we believe learning happens most effectively when it's offered in creative formats, within a community of peers, and when it focuses on all of life. While others have called this approach interesting, invaluable and innovative, the technical term is Integrated Learning.

But enough about what it's called. You want to know what Integrated Learning looks like, don't you? Well, picture this: Your English class (for example, Comp A, British Writers or Diversity in American Literature) delves into analyzing literary movements, examining literature and writing critical essays during a typical class period. The next time your class meets, more of your peers join you as your course "links" with a course of another discipline, such as Spiritual Formation. Together, you explore congruent topics, such as a literary genre that presents itself in both areas of study.

The same evening, you head to the CHILL for the Slam Poetry event where you have the opportunity to express yourself creatively and intellectually. Afterwards, you engage in discussion and debate with faculty, fellow students and the guest speaker, a published poet. This is a holistic way of educating oneself. This is Integrated Learning.

The Community Hub of Integrated Learning (CHILL) is where our community comes together. Students can meet up, hang out and study. They'll find the perfect nook to curl up with a good book, but there are also spaces ideal for study sessions with friends. Weekly Happy Hour get-togethers are hosted by campus organizations. At these events, students enjoy awesome freebies like iced mochas, root beer floats and homemade cookies (YUM!). Faculty, staff and students rally in the CHILL to engage in intellectual discussion, such as our recent "In Defense of Banned Books" event. As you can see, there's a reason this place is a hub at RC.





# ACE DAY:

Just steps away (literally, the two rooms are separated by a few stairs), is the Academic Center for Excellence (ACE).
