What makes us different? Our courses are taught from a value-oriented perspective as we prepare you for a life of service and success in all areas. Our challenging and innovative nursing program complements a liberal arts education in an environment that reflects Christian principles, high moral and ethical standards, and a global awareness. Our focus is on social engagement and excellence in the classroom. Faculty incorporate discussions and activities to help you gain the professional skills and knowledge you need, while also sharing their professional insights from years of experience in the field. The result of this philosophy is well-educated and compassionate graduates who can change their lives and the world for the better.

PRE-LICENSURE BSN The need for nurses continues to soar, and a growing number of hospitals are requiring RNs to hold a bachelor's degree, even for entry-level positions. The enhanced critical thinking and leadership skills gained through a nursing degree at RC equip nurses to better serve their profession and the world around them. The pre-licensure program curriculum requires 64 credits in the nursing major and allows successful candidates to sit for the NCLEX-RN.

RN TO BSN The RN to BSN program allows a registered nurse with an associate's degree in nursing to complete a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree in as few as 12 months. The flexibility of online education is built to fit your schedule, allowing you to be a nurse, parent, spouse and student while completing coursework from the convenience of your home.

NOTE: Nursing, general education and theological literacy courses (6 credit hours) are offered in an 8-week online format. Co-requisite courses are offered in a 15-week, face-to-face format. Rochester College accepts up to 90 semester hours of transfer credit and also gives credit for work as an associate degree RN. Applicants must be Registered Nurses with an Associate Degree in Nursing.

The Rochester College School of Nursing is pleased to offer freshman acceptance to qualified high school seniors. Freshman acceptance assures admission to the nursing program upon completion of prerequisite courses for the nursing major. Prerequisite courses must be completed within two years of initial enrollment to Rochester College.

CRITERIA FOR FRESHMAN ADMISSION

- · Minimum cumulative high school GPA of 3.4 on 4.0 scale
- · Successful completion (grade of B- or higher) of one year of biology, chemistry and algebra
- ACT composite score greater than or equal to 25 or SAT score of 1200
- · Enrollment at Rochester College following high school

APPLICATIONS

- Priority will be given to students who apply before Dec. 1
- · Each applicant will be interviewed by the RC SON
- Students will decline or accept offer by Jan. 1
- Please submit a brief essay describing the extracurricular and work activities in which
 you have been involved that have contributed personally to you and/or the community.
 Indicate how you believe these experiences have prepared you for a career in nursing.

UPON DIRECT ADMISSION, STUDENTS WILL:

- Maintain full-time enrollment at Rochester College
- Complete all prerequisite courses and be eligible for the nursing major within two years of initial enrollment
- · Pass Rochester College (non-nursing) courses with a C or higher
- · Pass RC SON nursing courses (NUR) with a B- or higher
