ELIGIBILITY & SELECTION REQUIREMENTS RU Early College

Acceptance into the RU Early College program will be based upon the following criteria:

- Completion of an application, including the required essays and letters of recommendation
- Hold and maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.7
- Submission of an up-to-date Educational Development Plan (EDP), including completion of a career interest inventory (if applicable)
- Demonstrate appropriate levels of proficiency on the Accuplacer Writeplacer test with minimum score of 5, or 25 or above on SAT Writing and Language exam
- Submission of a current high school transcript
- 6 Submission of an information release form and Parent Agreement form







ABOUT RU EARLY COLLEGE

The intent of the Early College program is to tailor high school plans to suit the needs of students, who will complete high school and/or college credits according to their EDP/ ILP plans in pursuit of Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degrees.

Students will be able to earn post-secondary credit at RU while simultaneously earning high school credit. High school and/or college credit will be awarded to students upon earning a passing grade in the respective class at the time of completion.

Students in grade 13 (year 5) will complete their final high school graduation requirement simultaneously as they complete the associate degree.

Successful participation in the program will depend on the ability to coordinate the high school/college schedule. Completion of the program will depend on student motivation, maturity and time management skills (among other factors).

EARLY COLLEGE PARTNERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP

RU will encourage the continuation of a successful college experience for enrolled students by offering the **Early College Partnership Scholarship**. Every RU early college graduate who completes an associate degree with a 3.0 cumulative GPA will receive a scholarship in the amount of \$7,500 per full-time academic year at RU. This scholarship will be effective up to four years from the date of college enrollment as a residential student in pursuit of a baccalaureate degree, provided a 3.0 CGPA is maintained. The amount will be higher if the student qualifies for additional scholarships within the college's scholarship matrix. With similar requirements, non-residential full-time students may be eligible for a \$3,750 **Early College Partnership Scholarship**.
