### A DEGREE IS JUST THE BEGINNING.

Here's how you can use your degree to positively impact lives, communities and the world.

**BEHAVIORAL SCIENCE • PSYCHOLOGY** These degrees allow graduates to seek entry-level positions in crisis intervention centers, counseling clinics and other human service agencies. They are primarily designed to be used in preparation for graduate studies in the fields of social services, psychology (clinical, counseling or school psychology, or marriage and family therapy), neuropsychology or psychotherapy. A master's degree is typically required to certify for practice in most agencies and for licensure as professional counselors.

STUDENT RESOURCE: MACKINION PSYCHOLOGY & COUNSELING CLINIC The role of the MacKinnon Psychology and Counseling Clinic at RU is to help meet the psychological and developmental needs of young adults who face major life transitions and adjustments while they are in college. Psychological services can provide coping mechanisms to help students succeed both academically and personally. Professional psychological and counseling services provided to Rochester University students through the clinic include individual psychotherapy, marital and family psychotherapy, and psychological assessments to assist in identifying the individual challenges of students with the goal of assisting them to be successful.
