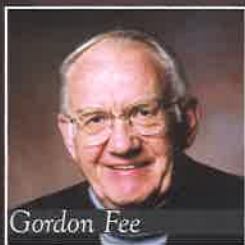

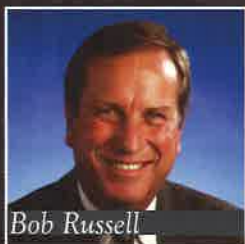

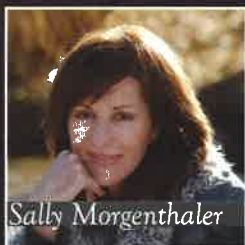
Reading 1 Corinthians

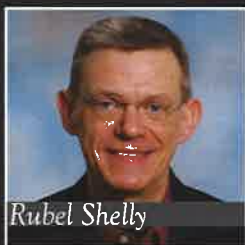
Reading 1 Corinthians and Working for Diversity and Justice
