DALNET DATABASE STANDARDS COMMITTEE MEETING Minutes - January 16, 1990

Present: Anaclare Evans (Chair), Chris Audia, Audrey Bondar, Helen Ma, Ann Sargent, Theresa Shen, Charlene Wecker, Karen Zinterhofer.

Absent: Ann Pogany

The meeting was convened at Wayne State University.

- A. Evans reported that she delivered the Minimal Level Records Standards document (with the revisions made at our last meeting) to P. Spyers-Duran today.
- A. Evans told the group that those that are planning to attend the ALA Summer meeting should arrange for hotel rooms as soon as possible. There are several conferences meeting in Chicago at the same time and hotel rooms will fill up quickly. NOTIS meetings will continue to be held on Friday, Saturday and Sunday evenings and all day on Tuesday. The current issue of American Libraries has information regarding summer ALA.
- C. Wecker reviewed the report from Nancy Hunn. A copy of this report has been sent to each DALNET library. In the course of reviewing the report, the following areas were discussed in some detail:
 - 1.) In response to N. Hunn's recommendation that a decision be made regarding the validation of 5xx fields, Committee members said that their staff have been retaining 5xx's on DALNET authority records regardless of whether a 1xx exists under the heading. The Committee recommends that this be established as policy.
 - 2.) The 4.6 release was discussed in some detail re: the Conflict and Error Detection reports, additional workload, etc.
 - 3.) Global change techniques were discussed, including A. Evans reviewing the characteristics of the three types.
 - 4.) The Committee expressed its great interest in having the LCSH tape purchased and loaded as soon as possible. This has already been put on the DALNET Project Managers' "wish list". Release 4.6 includes the capability to load LCSH updates.
- A. Evans reported on the series authority file retroconversion project that WSUL has been doing. Each cataloger spends 1/2 hour daily on this project. The first "pass" of the project is completed. Authority records for over 50% of the series were either already in NOTIS or were transferred from OCLC. Cataloging staff are now working on the remainder of the series. A description of this project will appear in the February 1990 issue of NOTISES.

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A. Evans prepared a draft of "Guidelines on Provisional Cataloging Records". These guidelines are intended to be for those provisional records created either for control of materials during processing or for control of temporary (e.g. rental) collections. In either case, the provisional record will be updated by a full MARC record or eliminated. Guidelines for the creation of provisional records that are created as "billing" records are included in a DALNET Acquisitions Task Force's document. The Committee reviewed A. Evan's draft and some modifications were made.

A. Evans reminded people that they should be reviewing on a regular basis their databases for title entries beginning with articles. LC's Cataloging Service Bulletin, No 41, dated Summer 1988* included a list of initial articles. Since some words are articles in one language and are not articles in another, it is necessary to proceed carefully.

The issue of "how much verification needs to be done?" for headings that cannot be verified as LC entries was discussed. It was suggested that headings not found be held for a period of time and then searched a second time in the LC NAF/SAF. After a second search, original authority records should be created, if required. A waiting period of 2 to 3 months should prove adequate.

Another issue discussed by the Committee was bibliographically closing the 362 (first indicator 0) field on serials records when there was no available proof. The Committee agreed that this field should not be closed without proof. A 362 (first indicator 1) field can be created with a note, e.g. Title ceased in December 1988?

The remainder of the meeting was spent discussing desired SAS reports. In addition to those listed in the minutes of the September 12, 1989 meeting, the following have been suggested.

- 1.) a report of titles which were published more than "x" number of years ago (for possible weeding)
- 2.) a list of unlinked records
- 3.) a list of titles held in a particular processing unit in shelflist order
- 4.) a list of titles for which no item records have been created Committee members should come to the next meeting with any additional desired SAS reports. A list of all suggested SAS reports related to the Cataloging/Authority Module will then be circulated to all DALNET Project Managers; they will be asked to both add additional ones and prioritize them.

The next meeting will be held in the WSU NOTIS Training Room on Tuesday, February 13 at 9:30; treats will be brought by C. Audia.

b) Terms of incorporation. Construct the reference to "match" the heading with regard to the presence, absence, or form of a term of incorporation.

Combined References

When reference is made to two or more different headings from the same form, trace individual references rather than listing on one combined reference all headings referred to through the cataloger-generated reference technique. Use a cataloger-generated reference only when a special explanatory referral legend is needed, e.g., for pseudonymous authors (cf. LCRI 22.2C).

Typographic Style

Generally, LC typographic style will not change.

Initial Articles

Treat references just as headings with respect to deletion/ retention of initial articles. See LCRI 22.4 for personal names, LCRI 23.2 for geographic names, LCRI 24.5A for corporate names, and LCRI 25.3A and LCRI 25.4A for uniform titles.

INITIAL ARTICLES

Initial articles are normally deleted from certain access points; when this is true, they are deleted whether in the nominative case or in some case other than the nominative. It is necessary to recognize initial articles, distinguishing them as necessary from other words that happen to be spelled the same as articles (cf. the English, Portuguese, etc., article "a" and the French, Italian, etc., preposition "a" or "a"; or languages that use the same form both for an indefinite article (comparable to English "a") and the number "one.") Such words when not serving as initial articles are retained. Also retained are plural indefinite terms that have the meaning though not the form of plural articles (English "some," French "des," Italian "qualche," etc.) Below is a list of initial articles. For the details of this policy as applied to bibliographic description and access points, see the following LCRIs:

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HAME AUTHORITY WORK IN CATALOG MANAGEMENT AND PUBLICATION DIVISION

Overview

The Catalog Management and Publication Division prepares and modifies name authority records (NARs) as a byproduct of its editing of bibliographic reports submitted by participating libraries for addition to the National Union Catalog (NUC) database.

Staff of the division create preliminary, provisional, and fully established name authority records for headings being used as main or added entries in the NUC database. (They do not create authority records for names used as subjects or for topical subject headings. They also do not routinely create series authority records.) Since they do their authority work online, most authority records are created and completed in one day.

The headings are constructed according to AACR 2 and LC policy. However, the staff do not normally search reference tools beyond those in the division's reference collection, do not telephone authors or publishers, and do not follow the procedures for verification of
