## Financial Aid at Michigan Christian College

A large majority of the full-time students at Michigan Christian College receive some form of financial aid, including various scholarship, grant, loan, and work programs. Their average aid package covers nearly two-thirds of the expenses for a full-time, boarding student. You, too, may be eligible for a large amount of aid. The MCC Financial Aid Office is eager to help you find the way to attend MCC!

## Scholarships

**Michigan Competitive Scholarship.** If you're a Michigan resident with financial need\* and you achieve a high ACT score, you may be eligible for a state scholarship of up to \$1,100 per year.

**Presidential Academic Scholarship.** If you have a 3.80 grade point average or above in high school and an ACT composite score of 30 or higher, you may receive a full-tuition scholarship, worth over \$4,200 per year.\*\*

**Academic Scholarship.** If you've maintained a 3.00 grade point average in high school, you qualify for a scholarship of \$600 to \$1,000 a year. Valedictorians and Salutatorians may receive an additional \$500 per year.\*\*

**ACT Scholarship.** An ACT composite score of 21 or more qualifies you for \$600 to \$1,000 per year.\*\*

**Associates Scholarship.** If you have a 2.75 grade average, you may be awarded up to \$1,000 a year.\*\*

## Loans

**Perkins Loan.** Depending on your financial need,\* you may borrow up to \$4,500 for your first two years of college at 5% interest.

**Stafford Loan.** Depending on your financial need,\* you may be able to borrow up to \$2,625 each year through your local bank or financial institution. MCC can identify alternate sources for a Stafford Loan if a local source is not available to you.

**PLUS/SLS Loans.** Parents and independent students, regardless of income, may borrow up to \$4,000 per year for college costs at a maximum interest rate of 12%.

## Work

**College Work Study.** This program offers part-time jobs to you on campus during the academic year and full-time in the summer if you have financial need.\*

**Off-Campus Employment.** You may find part-time jobs with area business firms through MCC's Student Services Office. MCC's ideal location in a suburban community provides countless job opportunities to students desiring an extra source of income or those including internships in their academic programs.

## Grants and Awards

**Pell Grant.** If you have financial need,\* you may be eligible for up to \$2,300 per year.

**Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant.** If you demonstrate financial need,\* you may qualify for additional funds up to \$4,000 per year.

**Michigan Tuition Grant.** If you're a Michigan resident enrolled in a private Michigan college like MCC, you may be eligible for a grant of up to \$2,150 per year, provided you meet financial need requirements.\* Only early aid applicants usually receive this grant.

**MCC Achievement Award.** If you demonstrate exceptional ability in sports, music, or drama, you may be eligible for an award of up to \$1,000 per year.\*\*

## Specialized Assistance

A variety of programs and organizations provide scholarships and assistance, such as **Veterans Benefits** and **Vocational Rehabilitation Benefits**.

## How to Apply for Maximum Aid

**Michigan residents** should submit an ACT Family Financial Statement (FFS) to MCC. MCC determines aid eligibility for all federal and institutional aid programs as a free service. Payment to "ACT" for one code listing and the State of Michigan should be enclosed for ACT to process the form for state awards.

**Non-Michigan residents** should submit an Application for Federal Student Aid (AFSA) to MCC. MCC determines aid eligibility for all federal and institutional programs as a free service.

After you submit the FFS or AFSA, MCC's Director of Financial Aid will determine your aid eligibility and prepare a financial aid package providing you with the maximum assistance available.
