

Four-year fields of study grow to nineteen

A recent decision by the faculty of Michigan Christian College brought the institution's number of four-year programs to nineteen, and the minor fields of study to twenty-four areas of instruction.

"This historic achievement reaffirms the college's commitment to providing quality liberal arts instruction from a distinctively Christian viewpoint, "said Dr. Ken Johnson, president. "Now, more than ever, students are discovering they can attend a Christian college in the North and complete a bachelor's degree without transferring."

Every degree program at MCC is de-

signed to prepare students for successful careers by combining quality academic instruction with practical job experience.

"Internships are required in every degree program," stated Dr. John Todd, assistant professor of political science. "Employers are now askina for more than graduates with diplomas in hand. They need men and women who have applied their undergraduate preparation through practical work experiences."

"Our programs are solid in academic content and practical work experiences. which is important to employers," noted Dean Larry Leslie. "At Michigan Christian College, your instructors not only prepare you for a good job. 
