## Construction plans announced by college

Unveiling the first phase of a new campus master plan, officials of Michigan Christian College recently announced plans to construct two residence halls, a campus commons, and a new entryway to the campus. Introducing a \$2.9 million fund-raising campaign for construction of the first phase, Dr. Ken Johnson, president of the college, stated, "Michigan Christian College is on the threshold of substantially greater value and service to young people.'

The heart of phase one, an attractive cluster building, will set the pace for a distinguished new campus image. The new facility will include a campus commons, flanked by two residence halls, one for men and one for women.

The new residence halls will each house seventy students. Arranged in suites with private bathrooms, each will include a central kitchen area for student use. Individual rooms will be fully furnished and equipped with telephone service.

Providing additional social space for the entire student body, the campus commons will include a lounge area with a large-screen television and a fireplace. An adjoining laundry facility also will be available for student use.

Relocation of the main college entrance during the construction process will allow the college to add new roadways and parking areas, as well as an attractive new entryway. The entrance will enhance the natural beauty of the campus, and promote a striking collegiate image for Michigan Christian College.

## Michigan Christian Warriors capture second at national tournament

Dubbed the *Cinderella Team* of the NSCAA, the Warriors of Michigan Christian College recently worked their way into the association's national championship game in basketball, and captured second place at the tournament before a crowd of over 1,000 loyal fans. In a special feature for the *Oakland Press*, writer Steve Addy stated, "After the big schools in Ann Arbor and East Lansing gave it the old college try and failed, it was left to the small college on Avon Road to carry the state's final four banner."

With a regular season record of sixteen wins and nine losses, and three tournament victories in hand, the Warriors entered the championship game with Mt. Senario College of Ladysmith, Wisconsin. Coach Garth Pleasant stated, "Despite the determined effort and great fan support, the Warriors were no match for the bigger, quicker, and more experienced team from Wisconsin."

Coach Pleasant is currently in his eighteenth year as head coach of the men's basketball program at Michigan Christian Col-

lege. He also serves as athletic director. A fan in attendance at the final tournament game reflected, "Your team played with great dignity, sportsmanship, and energy as they vied for the national title. The character of the team exemplifies the character of the coach who trained them so well."

In 1990, the Basketball Coaches Association of Michigan selected Coach Pleasant as the *Coach of the Year*. At that time, the

head coach of Oakland University commented, "Coach Pleasant studies basketball all of the time and knows the game. When I have a problem, I call him. Not only is he a great coach, but he is one of the finest persons I know."

The 1994 tournament marked the third time in the past ten years that the Warriors have played in the final game of the national championship tournament. The team won the national championship title in 1989.

# "2+2" programs provide unlimited choices

Some three years since its inception, the "2+2" degree program of Michigan Christian College continues to offer students a wide variety of academic options. Students enrolled in the program complete their first two years of study at Michigan Christian College, then go on to finish bachelor's degrees at other institutions in fields of study not offered by MCC.

"The '2+2' programs are unique in that the student doesn't merely complete the general education requirements of the freshman and sophomore year. Rather, they complete those requirements in close consultation with the college or university to which they will transfer for completion of the bachelor's degree," observed Dr. Larry Leslie, dean of academic services.

The "2+2" arrangement allows students to attend Michigan Christian College for their first two years of study, then guarantees transfer to another institution. "If a student formally enrolls under a '2+2' plan upon initial attendance at MCC, we'll guarantee transfer of their general education course work to another institution. We'll even pay for needed classes at the other institution if there is a transfer problem," Dr. Leslie added.

Just a few of the majors currently avail-

able under the "2+2" arrangement include elementary and secondary education, engineering, journalism, mass communication, human communication, nursing, theater, pre-professional studies, and numerous science-related fields.

"The '2+2' plans are great because you get the atmosphere of a Christian college while completing half of your degree reauirements. That's an opportunity you just can't beat," Dr. Leslie concluded.

## Enrollment climbs for third year in a row

"Applications are continuing to arrive in the Admissions Office at near-record rates," according to Toby Osburn, dean of enrollment services. College officials currently are preparing campus facilities to accommodate what may prove to be one of the largest student bodies ever at Michigan Christian College.

Numerous factors have contributed to enrollment growth over the past three years, including the addition of several four-year programs of study, enhancements of existing facilities, and increases

in scholarship programs.

Commenting on the third consecutive vear of enrollment growth, Candace Cain, dean of student services, noted, "We're ready! New carpet and furniture are in place in several rooms of the residence halls, and every room will get a good going-over by summer's end .'

"It takes a lot to get ready for the new students every year, especially when we're expecting more than the prior year. Our staff is committed to making every student's college experience an enjoyable one," Dean Cain added.

While applications continue to arrive daily, residence hall space is filling quickly.
