

An Authentic Experience: Nursing Skills Lab

At Rochester College, we want students to have an authentic experience to gain the confidence they need to carry with them throughout their careers. This is no different when it comes to the newly completed nursing skills laboratory, which allows nursing students to train in a hospital-like environment without any added pressure.

"Learning occurs best when a student can apply theoretical material," said School of Nursing Director Jaime Sinutko. "This lab provides the chance for practical application of nursing procedures and use of equipment. It will be a place where scenarios can be worked through to help students perfect the skills they'll need in their clinical studies."

Designed to mimic a real hospital, the lab includes eight hospital beds (donated by Crittenton Hospital), over-bed tables, a sink and a family of four mannequins, which are used to provide simulated clinical experiences. The mannequins even have a pulse and the ability to breath, making them great tools for practicing invasive nursing procedures.


